Shepherds Notes By Lee Fisher

SO FULFILL THE LAW OF CHRIST

Life is full of burdens. They slow us down, and wear us down. Sometimes our trials come because of life challenges, health issues, or the loss of someone we love. These trials will come unexpectedly, and sometimes in numbers, because Satan wants our souls, and he comes immediately while we are at our weakest point. If trials came in small doses, we normally would have the strength to overcome, and they can make us stronger. But sometimes they come so unexpectedly and with such force! It can seem like it's impossible to bear these trials and they may cause us to give up altogether. God has set up a safeguard against these often-heavy burdens; it's called the body of Christ-the church! It says in Galatians 6:2, *"Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ."* As Christians, we are to help each other carry those loads that weigh us down.

That's is why I'm so thankful for the congregation here at W.S. Young. Because for me and my family, you and other members of the body have fulfilled every part of Gal 6:2 and more in the loss of our daughter and sister in Christ. Sometimes I think, it is no wonder that when we separate ourselves from the church, we put ourselves in a position where it's possible to fall away from God. Jesus said: *"Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me"-*(John 15:4). For all of us, eventually there will be that one burden which may come, and it could possibly break us. Without the support of those who love God and love us, we can falter. It is so true: *"It is not good that man should be alone"-*(Gen 2:18). I cannot imagine going through a difficult life trial, or loss of a loved one by myself! Physical and mental trials are heavy weights that are hard to carry. Paul said the Philippians had done well when they shared in his distress-(Phil 4:14); they helped him carry the burden of his afflictions. James defines pure religion as visiting the fatherless and widows in their affliction ("pressures"). We must help each other bear life's afflictions.

So, brothers and sisters, continue to bear one another's burdens! If we are led by the Spirit we will *"through love serve one another"*-(Gal 5:13), *"love your neighbor as yourself"*-(Gal 5:14), and have the fruit of the Spirit! *"The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law"*-(Gal 5:22-23). If we allow God to guide us, then we will be carrying the burdens of others; if not, we may be placing more burdens on them by our actions. What a blessing it is to help each other find the freedom only found in Christ, and help others relieve the burden they carry!

Take one day at a time and look around-there are souls straining under their burdens! Reach out and help them! If you do, you may save a soul, or sustain your Brother or Sister in Christ! If not, their burdens may break them! *Peter says, "Be of one mind, having compassion for one another; love as brothers, be tenderhearted, be courteous"*-(1 Peter 3:8). Again, I thank God for your labor of love, and continue the good works that you are doing! *"For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them"*-(Eph. 2:10).

"DO YOU LOVE ME?"

We are all familiar with the question that heads this article. From the time we were little kids we have heard these words.

Our Lord used the expression on a few occasions:

"If you love Me, keep my commandments"-John 14:15. *"Simon, do you love me more than these"*-John 21:15.

Surely, you get the point. It is one thing to say, "I love you;" yet, quite another, to demonstrate it.

On another occasion Jesus pointed it out: "*Greater love* has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends"-John 15:13. Jesus demonstrated the love of God by dying that you and I might live.

A story was told one time by a convicted murderer. He had stopped a couple in their car on a country road. He demanded their money. Then, he told them, that he was going to kill both of them because they would recognize him and he would be executed.

The man began to plead: "Please, I beg of you. Kill me but spare my wife. I will have her to promise not to identify you. She will do it for me!" The man agreed. The husband was shot, but he let the wife live.

Later on, the man was arrested for another crime. His conscience got the best of him. He confessed to having killed that man on the road. He then said: "It has haunted me every since. That man loved his wife so much that he was willing to die that she might live!"

Now, that is what God did for us. Jesus said that He would die that we could live...and, He did it!

The scripture teaches that as Christians we should love each other, even as Christ loved the Church. Why is it that it sometimes takes a lifetime to see this major point? Only after a loved dies, we will say: "Oh, why didn't I tell her (or, him) how much I loved them every day?" You know what I mean! Don't let the time pass by! Be a doer of the Word! Express your love for your brethren. Say, we are even told to "love our enemies and to pray for them." Now, that is hard to do, but it was spoken by our Lord-Matthew 5:44. Our Lord prayed for those who were killing Him. Stephen knew what the Lord had done, so following His example, he prayed for those who stoned him to death-Acts 7:60.

When someone tells you that it is easy to be a Christian, just remember-we were also called to suffer for His sake. It is easy when things are going well, but when hurt comes, it is hard to turn the other cheek. Loving the unlovable is not easy to do, but it is the Christian thing to do!
