Workers in the Vineyard

We might be familiar with such terms as *minimum wage*, salary, paycheck, or some variation, but we likely are not familiar with a "day's wage." If someone were to ask you what you "make" you likely would respond (if you were so

kind as to oblige them that information) with your annual gross income. I doubt many of us have ever sat down taken the time to figure and factor what we would even make in a single day. In Jesus' time it was slightly different. In a few places throughout the Biblical text, we see the word *denarius* and it is said to be equivalent to the wages one would accrue for a day's work (*Matt. 20:2*). The Roman denarius had its beginning in approximately 211 B.C. It was a replacement for the lumps of bronze that were previously used as exchanges of some form of coinage or monies. The Roman denarius would have had a figure of the Caesar on one side with an inscription of his name and a seated woman on the other, possibly representing Rome, with an inscription of "Pontifex Maximus" (perhaps serving as a reminder to the people that they owed their wealth to Rome according to Everett Ferguson "Backgrounds of Early Christianity). This would have been the image Jesus requested in *Matthew 22:19* when He asked whose image the coin bore. There is a denarius of that exact sort in the British Museum for Caesar Tiberius, who ruled from A.D. 14-37 (exactly the period of Jesus' time on this earth).

It is the text in Matthew 20 that we'll study briefly. Why would Jesus have used the denarius as a figure in this parable? For all intents and purposes, His listeners would have understood a "day's wage" well. It was a common denomination of money that was used to count for even large needs (i.e., Philip's comment in **John 6:7** that they could not even feed the crowd of over five thousand people with "two hundred denarii" worth of bread). We can also glean from the parable of the vineyard workers the fairness of Jesus as Lord through this discussion related to the denarius. Surely the last portion of the parable indicates as much, for Jesus says, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong. Did you not agree with me for a denarius?" (**Matt. 20:13b**). Let me though also suggest to you another form in which the progression of the parable could indicate fairness. In the Roman world, the rich were willing to donate a great deal of monies to the public works and to various other needs but were guilty of not paying a fair wage to their workers. For evidence of such, note the warning to the rich in **James 5:1-5**. Jesus, of whom **fair** is nothing short of a gross understatement regarding what He offers mankind, would then be speaking of a landowner who gives what is right and is just.

Read with me the parable and then we'll discuss meaning and application:


"For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard. ² Now when he had agreed with the laborers for a denarius a day, he sent them into his vineyard. ³ And he went out about the third hour and saw others standing idle in the marketplace, ⁴ and said to them, 'You also go into the vineyard, and whatever is right I will give you.' So they went. ⁵ Again he went out about the sixth and the ninth hour, and did likewise. ⁶ And about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing idle, and said to them, 'Why have you been standing here idle all day?' ⁷ They said to him, 'Because no one hired us.' He said to them, 'You also go into the vineyard, and whatever is right you will receive.' ⁸ "So when evening had come, the owner of the vineyard said to his steward, 'Call the laborers and



give them their wages, beginning with the last to the first.' And when those came who were hired about the eleventh hour, they each received a denarius. ¹⁰ But when the first came, they supposed that they would receive more; and they likewise received each a denarius. 11 And when they had received it, they complained against the landowner, ¹² saying, 'These last men have worked only one hour, and you made them equal to us who have borne the burden and the heat of the day.' 13 But he answered one of them and said, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong. Did you not agree with me for a denarius? 14 Take what is yours and go your way. I wish to give to this last man the same as to you. ¹⁵ Is it not lawful for me to do what I wish with my own things? Or is your eye evil because I am good?' ¹⁶ So the last will be first, and the first last. For many are called, but few chosen." - Matthew 20:1-16

How might one interpret this parable? Remember that we have chapter markings in our Bibles, but Jesus is clearly (indicated by the word "therefore) continuing a discussion He has yet to finish. If you turn back one chapter, you'll note that He has just finished speaking with the rich young ruler who was unwilling to give up his riches to follow the Lord. Jesus then said it was difficult for the rich to enter the kingdom of Heaven (Matt. 19:23-24). Those listening to Jesus wanted to know then who could be saved. Jesus' answer to them in that chapter, and spilling over into chapter 20, was: whoever was willing to respond to the call and do what was requested of them. You might also remember that the Jews were going to have difficulty accepting Gentile converts into the church in the coming years. One might be Jew, Greek, German, American, male, female, rich, poor, young, or old; but so long as they believe in the Lord, answer the call to work in His vineyard, and persevere until the end of the day (Heb. 10:38-39), the same reward awaits all of God's servants. It is clear in the Bible that one cannot "earn" salvation, nor could he ever attempt to tell God he is "owed" anything (Lk. 17:10). However, God's grace and gift of eternal salvation to us also requires us to give of ourselves, to sacrifice whatever in the world might be holding us back from a Christian life, and to work faithfully in the service and obedience of our Lord in the vineyard until the "end of the day" comes (*Rev. 2:10*).
