"...Troubles and Trials Are O'er"

Music is amazing. The emotions that are conveyed or sparked by music range from happiness to love to sadness and any emotional waypoint in between on that wide spectrum of human feeling. Sometimes music can make us laugh and sometimes music can make us cry. That is especially true when the content of a song expertly matches the tone that is expressed by the musical instruments being played in the background. Maybe you can't get enough of the violin in a country song, the saxophone in a jazz song, or some other instrument that really *strikes a chord* with you (yes, pun intended, and I offer no apology for it). Music often allows us a way to express something that a mere conversation cannot.

Some of the best music is sans mechanics. It is acapella singing that is not accompanied by, and does not need to be accompanied by, instruments of any kind, save the human vocal cords God gave us. These songs, though lacking the sad guitar, the emotive piano, and the expressive drum, convey emotion like no other. Surely you have cried more than a few times during an acapella hymn. I cannot express what these songs mean, or the power with which they move you. It could be a hymn sung in a church service to praise the Lord, a song sung by a thousands of screaming sports fans, or some other type of acapella lyric. The sound of *only* human voices singing in unison and in company together is amazing. God's created musical instrument is unsurpassed. It is this type of song, in the realm of spiritual music, where more than a handful of tears have flowed in my lifetime. The song lyrics I'm about to list for you come from my mother's favorite song, so it will always hold a special place for me and always possess the power to pry open the tear ducts. The song is "Never Grow Old" and here are the lyrics I'd like to mention to you today, forming the basis of our article's focus:

"When our work here is done
And the life's crown is won
And our troubles and trials are o'er
All our sorrow will end
And our voices will blend
With the loved ones who've gone on before"

At some point in this life, our bodies will begin to break down. They weren't designed to live eternally. The oldest living person before the Great Flood lived to near -as-makes-no-difference a thousand years old. Following the Flood, the lifespan of man dramatically and quickly receded toward one hundred years instead. Today the average lifespan is under one hundred years old, and the deterioration of the body begins many years before that. Through the pen of Solomon, God instructed us about the future of the physical body. This tent (2 Cor. 5:1-4) houses our beings for a few number of years and then we move on to another place. In the Psalms we read of a lifespan being categorized as being seventy to eighty years (Ps. 90:10). The aforementioned text describing the process of the body's aging is eloquently and beautifully expressed in the last chapter of Ecclesiastes (12:1-7). If we are blessed to live long enough, inevitably

our bodies will fail us.

The failure of our bodies is evident when we see someone in pain. Recently I saw a man who is wearing the devastating effects of Parkinson's on his earthly frame. He has deteriorated to a point where walking is difficult, and the capabilities of once sure hands have all but vanished. My sons asked what happened to this gentleman and my wife and I told them about his disease. It is at such times we can take opportunities to teach our children about the brevity of life, the inevitable failure of our bodies, and the importance of living godly lives during this short time we have on this planet (Jms. 4:14). I was thinking, as I saw this old, bent Christian how that one day, because of the soul and heart he gave to the Lord, he will be given a body that won't fail him. He will be given a body that won't fight with him and cause him pain or frustration. He will be given a body that is designed to last for eternity.

"Beloved, now we are children of God; and it has not yet been revealed what we shall be, but we know that when He is revealed, we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is." -1 John 3:2

"Behold, I tell you a mystery: We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed-⁵² in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. ⁵³ For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality." -1 Corinthians 15:51-53

So let us hope in the God of Heaven, the Lord Jesus, and the Holy Spirit who has delivered to us these promises, that, though our earthly bodies will fail us repeatedly, and one day permanently, we have a future waiting in the presence of God where pain and deterioration simply won't be allowed to even exist (*Rev. 21:4*). As the chorus of the song lyrics listed above says, we're going to a place where we never grow old.
