Learning to See Like God

Paul told the Christians who comprised the Lord's church in Corinth to imitate him. What qualified the apostle who once persecuted the Lord's church to be worthy of instructing others to follow him? Was it not this apostle who rebuked the same group of Christians earlier in his letter because their allegiances were divided between Jesus and mere men? For starters, the apostle Paul was an effective preacher and servant for the Lord (1 Cor. 15:10). He had endured a

litany of harmful circumstances and acts of violence toward his person (2 Cor. 11:23-27). The apostle was even a wonderful model of humility; refusing to accept money from the Corinthians (2 Cor. 11:8). He even told Timothy that he was "chief" among sinners (1 Tim. 1:15). However, none of these commendable Christian attributes and fruits ordain him as worthy to be followed. He was a good man, but still just a man. When we open our Bible and read the entire quote, things begin to clear up. Paul wrote to those Christians as follows:

"Therefore, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God. "Give no offense, either to the Jews or to the Greeks or to the church of God, "just as I also please all men in all things, not seeking my own profit, but the profit of many, that they may be saved. 'Imitate me, just as I also imitate Christ."

-1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1

So the qualifications of worthiness to be followed or *imitated* did not rest on the authenticity of Paul's faith or the perfection of his spiritual endeavors; rather, it rested on the perfection of Christ and the steps of the Lord in which Paul was walking. Jesus is our ultimate goal. When someone obeys the gospel, their soul is safe in the hand of God and their name is written in that Book of Life. The journey, though, is only beginning. There is an initial salvation, but also the final salvation, when the fate of the Christian has been forever established on the day when their name is read out of that Book, and they are granted entrance into the Divine dwelling place of God (1 Pet. 1:5; Rev. 20:11-15). The guiding Light that will get us from initial salvation to the Day we are judged by the Lord is the Lord Himself, along with the instructions God has given us through His Spirit (*Psa. 119:105; Heb. 12:1-2*). Then, since the Lord is our guiding Light and the Lord is our Judge, He is the model to which we strive to follow and after which we mold our lives. Additionally, the Bible teaches us frequently and powerfully that Jesus was (and is) God (Rom. 9:5: Jn. 1:1-3). Jesus Himself told us that we should be like our Heavenly Father (Matt. 5:48), and the Spirit inspired the words that we should be holy "as He who called you is holy" (1 **Pet. 1:15**). Peter mentioned in that verse that we should copy/imitate God in all of our conduct or activities in life. Paul and Peter were excellent servants of the Lord, but the Lord is our bar for ultimate holiness.

In our brief space this week, I ask you to turn your attention to your estimation of others. For better or worse, we seem to almost attribute value innately to others in a vast array of settings based on what we *see* in those people. As a father, I want to impress upon my sons that good first impressions are important. They need to know that the way people *see* you the first time physically see you matters; regardless of whether it should or not. People in our everyday lives (grocery store, traffic, school, etc.) are likely to judge us and attribute a value to us based on a multiplicity of factors. We can control some of these factors, while others are permanent and uncontrollable (i.e. age, color of our skin, accent, height, gender, etc.). The reality is that people perceive something about us upon first sight that might never change. Perception can be reality, or it can be a mirage.

Yes, our world can be an unfair place to live sometimes. Christians are not the world, nor should they think or act like the world. We are *in* the world, but we are not *of* the world (*Jn. 17:6, 16*). Consequently, we should act and think like God as often as we can (*Phil. 2:5*).

One way to alter our activities and create further separation between our values and the values of the world is to modify the way we view/estimate/value (i.e. "see") other people. But how does God "see" people? God's measurement of a person consists little of the external adornment of a person (although we can adorn our physical appearances in an ungodly way), but rather the internal appearance of the heart, mind, and spirit. The Almighty told Samuel this exact thing about 3,000 years ago. God had dispatched Samuel to anoint a new king. Saul, the first king of Israel, had forsaken God and ignored His commands, and God was about to transfer the future of the kingdom to another man. Here's what the Bible says:

"Then he consecrated Jesse and his sons, and invited them to the sacrifice. ⁶So it was, when they came, that he looked at Eliab and said, "Surely the LORD's anointed is before Him!" ⁷But the LORD said to Samuel, "Do not look at his appearance or at his physical stature, because I have refused him. For the LORD does not see as man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart."

-1 Samuel 16:5-7

Whether it is as a friend, a companion to accompany you in some work of the church, a visitor who walks in the front door of the church building, a passerby in your daily life, a fellow member present in the worship service, or any other human being with whom we come into contact- estimate those around you based on the qualifications and measurements that God would utilize, and not the environmental and cultural methods we are taught by the world around us. See how God sees, and your life (and the lives of others) might just change in ways you never imagined (*Gal. 6:10*).
