The Only True Lamp

Exposure to the word of God opens a door which leads you into a room filled with a variety of volumes of literature. In this room the books are all adorned with different names and are composed by different writers. The books were written throughout the ages of the ancient world, spanning from 1,500 years before the birth of our Lord to approximately 70 years after His death. Today many secular books of antiquity are venerated as classics and possess outrageous financial and literary value. This specific collection of books excels every one of them. The value of these books, both individually and collectively, surpass any production of mankind; their financial, spiritual, ethical, mental, and salvific (ability to save) value is unmatched and incalculable.

This collection of books we know and endearingly refer to as "The Bible." In them the creation of the world, the nature and personality of God, the acting of God throughout history, the life and propitiatory offering of Jesus (along with His subsequent resurrection) are all recorded and codified. God's providence and oversight collected and preserved for us all that the Almighty desired us to know as we live out our short lives (Jms 4:14). In them we have all that we need to be the children of God and be invited through the gates of Heaven (2) Pet 1:3). The Bible has sixty-six books: thirty-nine in the Old Testament and twenty-seven in the New Testament. With the presence of so many varied books, can one assume there were different approaches to the revelation of truth and the recording of events? Of course! In fact, the Hebrews writer states that God has spoken to mankind in a multitude of means (*Heb 1:1-2*). It is only logical then for the serious Bible student to accept a responsibility to survey and study the books, chapters, paragraphs, and verses as units both collectively and individually, ascertaining their value as different forms of literature.

The reality of Bible reading (and hopefully progression to study 2 *Tim* 2:15) is that one cannot read all of the books the same way. Genesis and Leviticus are within arms-reach of each other in the Pentateuch, but their content is notably different, and the presentation of the material is not similar. One

does not approach Matthew in the same way as Daniel or Revelation. To be sure, this presents a bit of a lengthy journey for the Bible student who is pursuing biblical truth and enrichment. The varied presentations and recordings of God's revelation requires energy, devotion, intellect, desire, time, focus, research, and patience (*Acts 17:11*). The upshot, however, is enlightenment, a closer walk with God, a better knowledge of Jesus, and an ever-deepening appreciation for the collection of books in our Bible.

One place of intrigue is the collections of psalms. For many a year Christians have been quoting Psalm 23 for peace, turning to Psalm 18 in hope, reading Psalm 22 with a knowledge of the sufferings of Christ, or teaching their children to stay close to God with Psalm 1. For just a moment, allow me to direct your attention to the longest psalm in the collection. Psalm 119 contains 176 verses. The intricacies of the psalm extend much further than the length. This psalm is both an acrostic and alliterative. As we learned in our recent series on Calvinism (TULIP), an acrostic is a word or phrase in which each letter means something special. The eight verse sections of Psalm 119 all begin with the next successive letter of the Hebrew alphabet (Aleph-Tav = 22 unique sections with 8 verses apiece = 176 verses). Interesting as that is, as the old commercial said, "But wait, there's more!" The alliteration aspect is defined by the first word of a phrase beginning with the same letter (e.g. a preacher's sermon points all starting with 'D'). In each one of the 22 sections in Psalm 119, the first letter in the first word of each verse all begins with the letter for that section (vv. 1-8 all begin with Aleph, vv. 9-16 all begin with Beth, etc.). Perhaps most notable of this Psalm is verse 105, which both draws us back to the title of this article and sews up tidily the content of God's varied inspired word He delivered to us:

"Your word is a lamp to my feet And a light to my path." -Psalm 119:105

Indeed it is. The only real one this world has ever seen.

The grass withereth, and the flower thereof falleth away: 25 But the word of the Lord endureth for ever. And this is the word which by the gospel is preached unto you."

"24 And from thence he arose, and went into the borders of Tyre and Sidon, and entered into an house, and would have no man know it: but he could not be hid. 25 For a certain woman, whose young daughter had an unclean spirit, heard of him, and came and fell at his feet: ²⁶ The woman was a Greek. a Syrophenician by nation; and she besought him that he would cast forth the devil out of her daughter. ²⁷ But Jesus said unto her, Let the children first be filled: for it is not meet to take the children's bread, and to cast it unto the dogs. ²⁸ And she answered and said unto him, Yes, Lord: yet the dogs under the table eat of the children's crumbs. ²⁹ And he said unto her, For this saying go thy way; the devil is gone out of thy daughter. 30 And when she was come to her house, she found the devil gone out, and her daughter laid upon the bed.
