SO MANY DECISIONS!

In life, we make thousands of decisions each year, but when I think back on my past life and the decisions that I have made. Realistically There is only one decision that was the most important. The decision to believe and obey the Gospel and live a committed Christian life before God! Jeremiah said, "O Jehovah, I know that the way of man is not in himself: it is not in man that walketh to direct his steps." (ch 10:23). The decision to live as a Christian should be made early in life, yet some do not make that decision until they have created a wreck of their life. Remember this; whenever we make the decision to live without God's direction we will fall. Watch Where You're Going

Have you ever stumbled into someone because you were distracted, and they told you to "look out" or "watch where you're going"? I can only imagine in this day and age, where even some of our country's senior citizens seem to be incapable of going through the day without their smartphone, how many accidents are caused by being distracted. It was not long ago the state of Texas passed a law making it illegal to be looking at and operating one's cell phone whilst driving. If you ever wonder why people sit at a light after it has turned green, I have my suspicions it's because they're on their phone while stopped. Such laws might seem like government overreach or indicative of a "nanny state," but the reality is people sometimes need laws to coerce them to do what common sense will not. People have died because they were struck by a car (either as pedestrians or traveling in a vehicle themselves) whose driver was distracted by something. People have walked into objects, fallen from great heights, or even walked into traffic because they simply were not paying attention to where they were going. Keep your eyes up and be alert.

While such examples might justifiably cause us to reflect on our own actions and motivate us to think twice the next time we're walking or driving somewhere, the fullest application is in the most important facet of life: our spiritual journey. Everybody is (spiritually) going somewhere. Even those who do not want to know who God is or read His Book, are still going somewhere. Those who choose to stay at home and neglect the worship of the local church are still going somewhere. In like case, the individuals who are fighting against the "wiles of the devil" (*Eph 6:10-18*) are also going somewhere. Listen to the words of the Apostle Paul as he instructed a 1st Century congregation in regard to their activity:

"See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, ¹⁶redeeming the time, because the days are evil. ¹⁷ Therefore do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is. ¹⁸And do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation; but be filled with the Spirit, ¹⁹ speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord, ²⁰ giving thanks always for all things to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹ submitting to one another in the fear of God."

-Ephesians 5:15-21

Is it quite impossible to reach one's intended destination without looking in that direction. You don't back up a car without looking behind you (even if it's just the reverse camera), you don't walk through a doorway without looking ahead, you probably don't even eat without looking at your food. While there are certainly

some things we do in life without having to actually move our eyes toward the object (think about hitting that alarm clock with your eyes still closed or finding the restroom in the middle of the night because you've done it so many times you know exactly where it is), the majority of activity is accomplished by looking toward our destination. The same is true biblically. If you want to get to the eternal Kingdom, you have to look toward it (*Matt 6:33*). If you want to be like Christ, you have to look toward Christ (Col 3:1-10). If you want to go to Heaven, you have to direct your eyes to Heaven (2 Pet 3:13). There is a little kids song that says, "Oh be careful little eyes what you see" and "Oh be careful little feet where you go." Why does that matter? What is that important to teach children? Because where your eyes go, your feet go; and where your feet go, you go. I once saw a show on the Discovery Channel where the hosts of a popular show did a test to see whether or not you could actually walk in a straight blindfolded. It doesn't sound too hard, just put one foot in front of another. The results were powerful. Neither one could walk a straight line blindfolded. In fact, it wasn't even close. They walked in circles and were completely lost, even though they thought they were doing ok and going straight ahead. Keep your eyes open, keep them in the word of God, and watch where you're going. Because you control your ultimate eternal destination. God has given you the map, you just have to follow it without getting distracted and lost (*Psa 119:105*).
