Don't Lose Sight of Him

When is the last time you looked to the heavens and thought of God? The psalmist said, "My voice You shall hear in the morning, O Lord; In the morning I will direct it to You, and I will look up" (Psa 5:3). Have you ever looked up when you prayed or talked with Him, knowing in your innermost heart that He is out there somewhere, looking at you and listening to you (Psa 14:2)? The apostle Paul, in his letter to the Colossian Christians, exhorted them to mold their mindset in such a way that their focus was trained on Jesus (Col 3:5-10). Such has always been and will always be the recipe for success.

Sometimes in life our eyes fall. Sometimes we become distracted by the troubles and stresses of life. Sometimes the adversary afflicts us mightily and we allow the darkness of negativity and depression to cloud our outlook. Sometimes we subconsciously remove God from His premier position of priority in our lives, and we invite the adversary to spring into action. Sometimes we become overwhelmed by a valley that seems to only deepen and lengthen before we see the road leading out and up. These are the times when we must especially be "sober and vigilant" because the energy of the adversary exists in abundance and his desire is for us to stumble to the point of falling on that long road toward Heaven.

If someone begins to feel as if things are "off" and just not right in their spiritual life it could be because they have not set their eyes and mind firmly on the Lord Jesus and are not following Him on that pathway out of the valley (*Matt 7:13-14; Psa 23:1-3*). It might be though, that a weakness has been exploited by that dragon of **Revelation 12** and they're going to have to take back control of the direction before they go so far off course they fail to remember how to get back. There is a text in the Psalms that might help any who feel such a way. This text is not a license to walk away from God or to feel "ok" when not following faithfully; rather it is evidence that such a person would not be the first person to feel that way and it is a guide for how to solve it. In **Psalm 73** you see two sides of a man named Asaph- a discontent man and a grateful man. The psalm indicates that he began to look at the lives of those who weren't living as God prescribed and was, at least in some part, jealous of them (*Psa 73:3*). Look at a few of the verses:

"But as for me, my feet had almost stumbled; My steps had nearly slipped. For I was envious of the boastful, When I saw the prosperity of the wicked. For there are no pangs in their death, But their strength is firm. They are not in trouble as other men, Nor are they plagued like other men. Therefore pride serves as their necklace; Violence covers them like a garment. Their eyes bulge with abundance; They have more than heart could wish. They scoff and speak wickedly concerning oppression; They speak loftily. They set their mouth against the heavens, And their tongue walks through the earth. Therefore his people return here, And waters of a full cup are drained by them. And they say, "How does God know? And is there knowledge in the Most High?" Behold, these are the ungodly Who

are always at ease; They increase in riches. ¹⁸ Surely I have cleansed my heart in vain, And washed my hands in innocence. ¹⁴ For all day long I have been plagued, And chastened every morning." -Psalm 73:2-14

It seemed to this man that the wicked had life going pretty good for them. Sometimes in life today it can seem as if many do not want God in their life seem to have an overflow of money and things and economic security. He even knew that his community (generation, church, family, etc.) would disagree with him; he knew he shouldn't actually say that out loud.

How did he resolve his problem? He went to God. When he went to God, he reevaluated life based not on the temporal physical and material goods of others, but on the regrettable spiritual end they would inevitably face. God's truth gave him an attitude adjustment:

"Thus my heart was grieved, And I was vexed in my mind. ²² I was so foolish and ignorant; I was like a beast before You. ²³ Nevertheless I am continually with You; You hold me by my right hand. ²⁴ You will guide me with Your counsel, And afterward receive me to glory. ²⁵ Whom have I in heaven but You? And there is none upon earth that I desire besides You. ²⁶ My flesh and my heart fail; But God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever." -Psalm 73:21-26

When he realized that he'd been looking at life through the wrong glasses he reestablished his commitment to God and praised Him for His goodness and power. When the road before you looks crooked and you feel as if you're in a dark valley, falling behind the Shepherd, make sure you point your eyes at Him and He will be there, leading you to His house (*Heb 12:2*).
