God Gives You Wings

Allow me to go out on a limb and assume that you are familiar with some pretty big names in the community of human civilization (big in importance, not length). Your age and generation might alter somewhat the content of those names because not all young people will have studied enough history to know the names of influential characters of vesteryear ('those ancient relics and their outdated ways') and not all mature people will have cared to keep up with the goings-on of today's culture ('these kids and their whiz-bangs and newfangled ways'). However, the point remains, you know some big names. Maybe the scope of the names you know are as wide as the cultures which have dotted the landscape of our world: Methusaleh, Abraham, Confucius, Alexander, Antiochus Epiphanes, Vespasian, Augustine, Mohammed, Napoleon, Isabella, Ferdinand, Elizabeth, Oppenheimer, Eisenhower, Churchill, Nixon, Gorbachev, Bush, Clinton, Putin, or Musk. But do you know Dietrich Mateschitz? I didn't until I started to write this article. You might not know 'ol Dietrich, but you know his product. According to research, in the mid-1980s he created a formula of beverage inspired by a drink in the Far East. The name of this drink is emblazoned on the side of professional racing vehicles, out front of your local gas station, and even on the drink menu at the local Sonic Drive-In. We know his product as Red Bull. The world-famous slogan of Red Bull promise that is "gives you wings" (maybe you've seen their somewhat caricatured commercials). Just drink a Red Bull and you'll fly away either to something good or away from something bad.

The "wings" discussed, even by the beverage's slogan, are clearly not literal; rather they are metaphoric, implying a lift of some sort to your mind or body, such as energy or focus. While Red Bull can definitely give you a little "pick me up" (especially if you're sensitive to caffeine or choose an option with sugar), the effect is superficial and temporary. The wings that God provides far outpace and outmatch any sort of lift that can be given to you by materials of this world or her contents. Such as the "peace that surpasses all understanding" (*Phil 4:7*), the impact of God in our lives and the force with which He can uplift, motivate, and encourage us is impossible to be measured by worldly standards and certainly cannot be met by them.

One question an inquisitive person might ponder is, "In what way does God uplift me?" Space does not allow to enumerate all of the passages or facets of life in which God offers potential impact and improvement. God, quite literally, blesses us with exaltation and gifts in dozens of aspects of life. The easy answer might be that He does so through His word, for His power has given us everything necessary to engage in life and meet all of its unique challenges (2 Pet 1:3). God's word is truth (Jn 17:17) and truth can release us from that to which we have been and can still be bound (Jn 8:32).

However, to say that God's word is what gives us wings, while accurate, is somewhat of a generalization and incomplete. God's word, which was Divinely inspired (2 Tim 3:16; 2 Pet 1:21), is not all that God has done for us. It affords for us a place to read of God's power, but it was not the totality of God's power. The Scripture from God is our authoritative guide and encapsulates what is needful to know God, but, if I may expand on the real point of this paragraph, it is that there was a particular activity and work, premeditated and executed by God, which provides us the uplifting His word

revealed to us. We find a well-known preface to this activity in the book of Isaiah:

"Comfort, yes, comfort My people!" Says your God. ² "Speak comfort to Jerusalem, and cry out to her, That her warfare is ended, That her iniquity is pardoned; For she has received from the LORD's hand Double for all her sins." ³ The voice of one crying in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the LORD; Make straight in the desert A highway for our God. ⁴ Every valley shall be exalted And every mountain and hill brought low; The crooked places shall be made straight And the rough places smooth; ⁵ The glory of the LORD shall be revealed, And all flesh shall see *it* together; For the mouth of the LORD has spoken." -Isaiah 40:1-5

These verses very clearly relate to the coming of John the Baptist, who would be the inaugural herald of the arrival of the person of our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ. This connection is established in Scripture by Matthew, Mark, Luke, John the Baptist, and Jesus. There is no question that John was the promised herald prophesied of by Isaiah. And what was going to be his mission? To proclaim the imminent kingdom and the Messiah who would establish it. This he did and encouraged his followers to follow Jesus (*Jn 1:29-35; 3:29-31*).

Interestingly enough, did you know that the passage used frequently about the "wings" God can offer us comes from the same book as the prophecy about John? But wait, there's more. The passage regarding God giving us wings is found not only in the same book, but even in the same chapter. At the end of the same section of text in Isaiah we read:

"Have you not known? Have you not heard? The everlasting God, the LORD, The Creator of the ends of the earth, Neither faints nor is weary. His understanding is unsearchable. ²⁹He gives power to the weak, And to those who have no might He increases strength. ³⁰Even the youths shall faint and be weary, And the young men shall utterly fall, ³¹But

those who wait on the LORD Shall renew their strength; They shall mount up with wings like eagles, They shall run and not be weary, They shall walk and not faint."

-Isaiah 40:28-31

So then, can we not connect the two ends of the chapter and conclude that the primary source of God providing His creation "wings" to soar above their problems, to something good and from something bad, is through the message that John the Baptist preached? That message was the Messiah, the Lord who would save the world from their sins. Through the preaching of Jesus and the invitation to enter His kingdom and the promise that He would be "with" (*Matt 28:20*) His disciples, God truly gives us wings.
