### Don't Be a Church Mouse

It's interesting how certain animals are spoken of by God. One of the most overlooked and disliked common animals in this world is probably the ant which, interestingly enough, is an animal about which the Bible speaks highly (*Prov 6:6-11*). Animals are spoken of in the Bible in such a way that certain attributes are expressed through them; like the swiftness of an eagle (*Deut 28:49*), the strength of a lion (*2 Sam 1:23*), the speed of a gazelle (*1 Chron 12:8*), the strength of horses (*Jer 12:5*), the restlessness of a bird (*Prov 23:5*), and the harmlessness of a dove (*Matt 10:16*). Surely more examples exist, but these are a strong enough representation of how God attributes various abilities of an animal to something experienced in the world.

Additionally, it's interesting how certain animals are utilized by mankind. We use elephants to represent good and incredibly long memories, a large uncomfortable subject that cannot be avoided, and as one of the main political parties of our country. While there are a variety of other animals we could discuss, along with properties delineated which we copy from them, turn your mind to the animal that can alter the path of an elephant- the mouse. Mice are not everyone's favorite animal. You might be one of those people who would rather not see a live mouse again in life; and you certainly don't want it running across your foot in the middle of the night. Mice are often associated with quietness and timidity. Have you ever heard someone describe a woman as being 'mousy'? They aren't insinuating that she is furry or likes cheese. The mouse has carried the connotation for many years as being equal to timidity or quietness. When you read the title of this article did you think of the word 'quiet' (e.g. someone being "as quiet as a church mouse")? I don't know if I've seen a mouse in our church building, but nevertheless, the phrase abides.

There are times in life when we need to be quiet. Frequently in life there are times for a variety of opposing actions (*Eccl 3:1-8*). For instance, Paul urged those who were being too free with their tongues and engaging in unwise activity to "work in quietness" (*2 Thess 3:11-12*). You and I are also encouraged by the Bible to pray for the leaders of our country so that we might continue to exist and worship in peace and quietness (*1 Tim 2:2*). There is something to be said for quietness in life, if for nothing else to notice God and experience the world He created while we meditate on His word (*Psa 46:10; 1:2*).

Not every facet of life requires quietness. In fact, there is one avenue of the life of a Christian where quietness is forbade. When someone asks you why you're a Christian, or for some reason as to why you possess the mindset of optimism and faith which you make manifest in your mannerisms and way of life, the apostle Peter said to give an answer (1 Pet 3:15). Let me suggest, in this same vein of life, a time in which we are not quiet, but bold. When someone asks about the Bible, when they question right and wrong, when they express any curiosity in your belief in a precept of God's word, or when you are presented with an opportunity to draw a distinct line between what is right and wrong- do not be a church mouse. Be bold. The early church was bold and even prayed for boldness in the face of opposition (Acts 4:24-30). Why should we be bold? Not because we are antagonistic in our natural or learned personality, but because we're right. While I admit that might sound arrogant, it is a fact. Those who speak from God's word, are speaking as taught by God. Jesus told His early disciples they would be mistreated and brought before the leaders of their age. He told them when that happened, they would be given words to speak:

"19 But when they deliver you up, do not worry about how or what you should speak. For it will be given to you in that hour what you should speak; "9 for it is not you who speak, but the Spirit of your Father who speaks in you." -Matthew 10:19-20

I encourage you to speak when questioned about right and wrong because, if you speak from the word of God, you are expressing to the world the Holy Spirit's teaching. Since we have the words of God and can know what He wants the world to know, let us have the boldness to speak. When it comes to truth versus error, do not be a church mouse (Acts 4:20).
