Be Careful With Your Bible

Saying that we live in a fast-paced, ever-changing world is an understatement. I read an article recently that McDonalds is planning to do away with all of their self-service soda machines in their restaurants by 2032 because the pandemic initiated a seismic shift in the habits of consumers. Apparently, people do not go *inside* as many food establishments as much as they used to; instead opting for drive-thru, delivery, or take away services (e.g. Door Dash, Favor, Grub Hub, etc.). Companies like Amazon have, likely forever, changed how consumers and distributors alike do business. Many stores like Wal-Mart, Best Buy, and any number of other established brick-and-mortar stores have changed their policies so as to deliver products you can simply either pick up at a specific area of the store without waiting in line or have them delivered to your home in a few days. Our Bibles have received this same 21st Century treatment.

In "the good old days" everybody would walk into services with a Bible in hand. Kids would have covers on their Bible and perhaps a little notebook and some colors, the mom might have straps on her Bible cover with some painted flowers on the cover or an imprinting of a particular popular scripture, and the dad would carry his uncovered Bible in his arms etched at the bottom right of the front with his name in cursive font. That doesn't always happen anymore. Many of us have a multiplicity of Bibles on the electronic device that we do not allow to escape more than three feet from our person. Just as we would open that device and click on the Chase app to see how much money was in the bank, or click on the Dominos app to order dinner, we likewise click on the app emblazoned with a picture of a Bible and, voila, we open up the digital library consisting of essentially any English translation of the Bible we wish. This doesn't have to be a negative. In fact, it is a tremendous blessing that people have such unfettered and cost-effective access to God's word. Almost everyone has a phone of some sort that can download apps. How amazing is the advancement of technology that God's word, once inspired through the Spirit to be written on a piece of papyrus or parchment, could be so easily accessed by anybody, anywhere, and at any time. And that, on a device that we *never* let out of our sight. You almost can't lose your Bible!

However, you do need to still be careful with your Bible. Surely some people still need to be careful with their physical Bible and where they leave it and how they treat it. Bibles are easy things to forget where you left them and can be damaged beyond saving. The care we show for our Bible that is being addressed herein is not only speaking of the physical way in which we hold, carry, or touch our Bibles- though surely, we should care for them in that sense too; they are, after all, the most important book in the entire world. The pinnacle of care that you should consider giving your Bible is *the way you use it*. Your manner of use is not restricted to the physical treatment of it. The Christian should be cautious how he or she utilizes the Bible in their lives, conversation, discussions, and teaching. We know the Word of God is powerful:

"For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart." -Hebrews 4:12

"All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, ¹⁷that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work." - 2 Timothy 3:16-17 However, it is not a weapon or a tool that should be used carelessly. An ax is powerful too, but if you use it without proper respect, care, or skill you can seriously injure yourself or someone else.

Perhaps one of the great weaknesses humanity exhibits with the Bible (other than not reading or believing it) is wielding it inappropriately. It can be easy to take the way we view the world and read that into the Bible (that's called eisegesis). What God wants us to do is to take His word and get His intended teaching from what's written (that's called exegesis) and use that on our soul and the souls of others. There are wide, many, and varied ways in which people have taken a scripture or whole passages out of context. Just recently I heard someone try to use Jesus calling Lazarus out of the grave as a metaphor for LGBT people coming out of the closet. While many twistings of the text aren't that blatant, they still can be twisting Holy Word altogether. The Bible is not a collection of witty sayings we are free to use as we see fit; it is a divinely inspired message of totality that is designed to tell us who God is, what He has done for us, and what we can do to live where He is when our entrance into eternity begins. The Bible is a book designed to save souls, not win arguments, or make people act like we want them to. When you use your Bible, do so carefully, ensuring that you know what the phrase or verse means that you're about to use and that you are going to use it in a manner that is pleasing to God and in accordance with the appropriate context of His divine message (2 Tim 2:15).
