Unearthing GemsBy Phil McIntosh

Have you ever gone digging in your backyard as a kid or maybe at the beach with your family and uncovered something buried in the ground? It's fascinating to unearth something previously hidden. Oftentimes it is a piece of an old bottle or perhaps some form of metallurgic money, but occasionally people have found some extraordinary things in the ground. People have found arrowheads, bullets, rings, and less savory items such as remains of animals or even people long departed. If you are one who enjoys learning about the past, then these types of discoveries are thrilling. Those who observe objects of antiquity are able to connect to the past and past civilizations in a way previously impossible; you can connect in a way that book reading and documentary watching simply cannot duplicate. Simply put, these finds and others make history come alive.

We as Christians are more interested in artifacts of a biblical nature than we are George Washington's sword or a canon from the Civil War. Of those sort of ancient artifacts there are an abundance. In a recent sermon we discussed the Assyrian King Sennacherib (705-681 BC) who attacked the Israelites at Lachish and planned to attack Jerusalem (*Isa 36:13-20*). Artifacts found relating to this king range from his famous relief (a gypsum carving of sorts) which displays the conquest of Lachish to Sennacherib's Prism, which outlines his victories. Such finds as these allow the past to stand on our front door; we are transported through these materials back some 2,500 years and see the evidence of the people, kingdoms, power, war, and the results. We are also shown God. These finds do not need to "prove" the Bible; we believe the Bible is exactly what it says it is- it is the word of God, as determined by God, delivered by God's Spirit (*2 Tim 3:16; 2 Pet 1:20-21*). However, they do corroborate the Bible and lend evidence to the biblical account as God has revealed it to us. The artifacts unearthed can serve to strengthen our faith in God's word while we live among a generation who are critical toward the accuracy and inspiration of Scripture.

One such "gem" was recently unearthed that has been traced even further back in antiquity than most. Many artifacts relate to the time of the United Kingdom (1040-920 BC), the Divided Kingdom (920-721 BC), the Exilic period (720-538 BC), or the Post-Exilic period (538-250 BC- if we use the beginning Roman rule as a guide). Surely there are an abundance of finds during the period of the Hasmonean Dynasty and Roman rule, but those aren't quite of the age we're aiming at here for "ancient" finds. The specific artifact I wanted to bring to your attention dates earlier than all of those periods, but before we see it, let's learn about what portion of Scripture to which it is connected.

After the Israelites had been freed from their Egyptian captivity, God took them through the Sinai peninsula and toward Canaan. You might remember that the older generation lacked trust in God, ultimately falling in the wilderness as a direct result of their faithlessness (*Num 14:26-37*). It was to the younger generation Moses spoke the words of the book of Deuteronomy as they planned to enter the Promised Land (*Deut 1:1-4*). In *Deuteronomy 11*, we find these words related to some future activity once they reached that land of promise:

"Behold, I set before you today a blessing and a curse: "the blessing, if you obey the commandments of the LORD your God which I command you today; "and the curse, if you do not obey the commandments of the LORD your God, but turn aside from the way which I command you today, to go after other gods which you have not known. "Now it shall be, when the LORD your God has brought you into the land which you go to possess, that you shall put the blessing on Mount Gerizim and the curse on Mount Ebal." -Deuteronomy 11:26-29

Also, later on in the book we see the curses specifically listed which they were to offer up once in that land:

And Moses commanded the people on the same day, saying, ¹² "These shall stand on Mount Gerizim to bless the people, when you have crossed over the Jordan: Simeon, Levi, Judah, Issachar, Joseph, and Benjamin; ¹⁸ and these shall stand on Mount Ebal to


curse: Reuben, Gad, Asher, Zebulun, Dan, and Naphtali. "And the Levites shall speak with a loud voice and say to all the men of Israel: "Cursed is the one who makes a carved or molded image, an abomination to the LORD, the work of the hands of the craftsman, and sets it up in secret." "And all the people shall answer and say, 'Amen!" ... (and thus these curses continue until verse 26).

- Deuteronomy 27:11-26

When you turn your Bible over to Joshua chapter 8 you see Joshua "built an altar to the Lord God of Israel in Mount Ebal", the Israelites divided up to pronounce the blessings cursings, and Joshua read that account from Moses to them (Josh 8:30-35).

While you and I should (and hopefully do) believe that account on its face, something recently unearthed stands to corroborate the details of such verses. In December of 2019, a woman who was working with the Associates for Biblical Research (ABR) was wet sifting some contents from a dump pile that the late Dr. Adam Zertal had taken from Mt. Ebal in the 1980s. The artifact she found is what they call a *defixio*, or a "curse tablet." It was a small lead tablet, folded over, which was scanned with tomographic scans by the Academy of Sciences of the Czech Republic to reveal what was inside. And what was inside was extraordinary. They found inside words penned which represent a proto-alphabetic text written in an intelligent form of literary structure called a chiasm (e.g. I love my wife, she's good to me; she's good to me, I love my wife). Here is what the defixio said (from ABR):

You are cursed by the god *yhw*, cursed. You will die, cursed – cursed, <u>you will surely die.</u> Cursed <u>you are</u> by *yhw* – cursed.



Fascinatingly, not only do we have an old Hebrew script with the earliest known usage of the Divine name (YHWH), but we also have connections to Moses' speech, the Israelites' entrance into Canaan, and the altar Joshua built on Mt. Ebal. In addition, we also have evidenced by this artifact, proof that ancient people could

speak and write intelligibly, a blow to those who question the abilities of ancient writers. ABR believes this artifact dates to the Late Bronze Age (1500-1150 BC). Can you imagine that possibility? Not only does this "curse tablet" corroborate the content and accuracy of Deuteronomy and Joshua (and, by extension, the entire canon of God's word), but it also represents a tablet that could conceivably have dated back to almost the very time of Joshua himself! Certainly this is a "gem" that has been unearthed. So we march on, appreciating the gems that point to the Bible, and trusting God as Divine and Infallible (*Rom 3:4*).
