Go To The Ant

Another year is drawing to a close. Again. Already. Has this year flown by for anybody else? I have heard that time flies by the older we get, but until I experienced it, it didn't fully make sense. We know time doesn't actually move any quicker, but our perception of time seems to morph. The busier someone is, the more they seem to perceive the acceleration of the passage of time. Maybe there's something to this whole "stop and

smell the roses" thing people say. If all you do is 'go' you miss a lot.

The wise man said there was a time for every purpose under heaven (*Eccl 3:1*). One of those purposes could be the recharging of batteries when overburdened. Even our Lord Jesus spent time away from the hectic schedule of daily life, praying by Himself often (*Lk 5:16*). The Lord also realized that a crazy schedule could have an impact on those engaged in work; thus He invited His disciples to "come...to a deserted place and rest a while" (*Mk 6:31*). The text mentions they had been so busy they didn't even have time to eat. Surely you've had times like that. You know what exhaustion means. You know what being "dog tired" is like.

One cure to exhaustion (or rather treatment because the only cure for retiring from labor is death) is rest. The Israelites were not only encouraged to rest but commanded to (Exod 20:10-11). The Jews did not even move around much on Sabbath, walking distances of less than a mile. Maybe you relax some on Sunday and maybe you make time to rest during the evenings after work during the week. Perhaps one great blessing of the "holiday season" is the inherent rest built into most people's calendars. Many will take a little of time away from the hustle and bustle of their normal lives to visit with friends or family and kick their feet up for a little bit. There can be small "pauses" to a busy schedule during the holiday season. Those little pauses can be healthy and beneficial. Pauses, however, are not stops. We pause a movie to take a snack or bathroom break, but it is only designed to be momentary and then we get back to the action. So it should be with our lives. The Bible warns against idleness and encourages us to find good works in which to engage as Christians. While we might be tempted to allow our "pause" to extend from Thanksgiving to Christmas, let's not allow that button to remain pressed for that long. Look at the encouragement and lesson given by God in the Old Testament wisdom literature:

"Go to the ant, you sluggard! Consider her ways and be wise, ⁷ Which, having no captain, Overseer or ruler, ⁸ Provides her supplies in the summer, And gathers her food in the harvest. ⁹ How long will you slumber, O sluggard? When will you rise from your sleep? ¹⁰ A little sleep, a little slumber, A little folding of the hands to sleep- ¹¹ So shall your poverty come on you like a prowler, And your need like an armed man." **Proverbs 6:6-11**

The ant knows how to take care of business. She doesn't pause life for long at all. What can we learn from the ant that we can put into practice? Well, 2024 is near. Maybe you start making plans for areas in your life where you might improve in the next year. Seeking improvement and maturation in your mind, heart, soul, and knowledge is commendable and well within the framework of God's expectations for your life.

We have only for sure each day we wake up, and even then, all twenty-four hours aren't guaranteed. Knowing then that time is not promised and there is still time to go before the New Year, think of ways you can improve during this month. Be like the ant and get to work. There are worship services, Bible classes, church activities, benevolence opportunities, and visits to make this month. Hopefully we all enjoyed our "pause" during Thanksgiving week, but now let's see what our "play" button can do before we hit pause again toward the end of this year (*Eph 2:10*).
