## It's Almost Time for Thanksgiving

The weather outside has begun to provide a reprieve from the intense heat of a southern summer. During the months of June through August in Texas you can pretty much be assured the temperature will begin with a 1 and have three digits. Perhaps this year was hotter than other years; it at least seems as if that is the case, but it's hot in Texas every summer. Regardless, the temperature pendulum has finally begun to swing. This past week our temperatures even dipped into the 30s. I don't know about you, but for me that means comfy clothes and some source of heat. This time of year is my favorite for a variety of reasons. Maybe it's yours too. Many people love the Autumn (and the plethora of pumpkin spice this or that which always accompany it) and the rush to the 'holiday season.'

Our bulletin article is not designed this week to focus on the history of the day or how people observe it, though for many it likely includes some combination of turkey, sweet potatoes, rolls, dressing, and football. The element that should stick out, but might far too often be overlooked, is the gratitude with which we should view a time when we count our blessings and share in time around our loved ones. Let me ask you a question: do you gather for feasts for a reason or because it's just "what you do" when that time of year comes? The people of Israel in antiquity had a multiplicity of feast days and time throughout the year, some instructed by God, and they were to serve various specific purposes. As Christians, our lives are different from those ancient Israelites because our feast is the Lord's Supper which we commemorate and experience every first day of the week. As far as Thanksgiving (or any other seasonal or annual gathering), it is primarily for national and cultural tradition that we gather. Is there not still a purpose though?

Have you ever gone around your table, gathered on Thanksgiving Day (or a day close to it for scheduling reasons), and each person mentions something for which they are thankful? Maybe it's cliché, maybe it might even feel a little sappy, but there is value in voicing that for which we are internally grateful. In fact, being grateful is one of the attitudes which should typify Christians. Gratitude is one of the purest forms of expression by which we offer a piece of ourselves back to God, acknowledging how humble we are and how overwhelmed we continue to be for all of the blessings with which He has poured into our lives. Moses wrote in *Leviticus 22:29*, "when you offer a sacrifice of thanksgiving to the Lord, offer it of your own free will." Gratitude cannot be forced; it should be voluntary and pure.

There are two pieces of Scripture I'd like to present to you this week for your consideration. Perhaps you can use these to guide or modify your life as you live for the Lord (*Rom 14:8*). The passages both come from the apostle Paul's letter to the body of Christ at Corinth. Read these, Colossians 2:6-10 and 3:14-15 respectively (I bolded the

text for emphasis):

"As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, <sup>7</sup> rooted and built up in Him and established in the faith, as you have been taught, *abounding in it with thanksgiving*: <sup>8</sup> Beware lest anyone cheat you through philosophy and empty deceit, according to the tradition of men, according to the basic principles of the world, and not according to Christ. <sup>9</sup> For in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily; <sup>10</sup> and you are complete in Him, who is the head of all principality and power."

"But above all these things put on love, which is the bond of perfection. <sup>16</sup> And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to which also you were called in one body; *and be thankful*."

It might be the case that you go around your Thanksgiving table with family and friends, each of you offering some reason why or some blessing for which you are grateful. It might be the case that you think of, pray about, or tell others every day in November some reason for gratitude toward God. Let me submit to you as we begin this month that being grateful on Thanksgiving Day, while commendable, is not enough; being grateful every day in November still falls short of our calling. Christians are encouraged to be thankful to God every day. The blessings which we enjoy, though varied from others around us, surpass what our works deserve. For our works, both good and bad, can provide for us no better standing in the eyes of God without His grace and mercy (Eph 2:8-9). Since all that we have, use, spend, live in, drive, wear, see, and any other way we might mention by which we experience God's blessings, come from God- then let us constantly and continually offer Him the praise of our lips and our hearts. Let us not be grateful on Thanksgiving Day alone or only throughout the entire month of November; let us be grateful every day that He allows us to be a part of being His creation, to experience both the physical and spiritual blessing of being His family (Eph 3:14-*15*).
