#### With One Voice

Why is the American political system so divided? That's a big question, huh. Let's not deal with the myriad of intricacies for why our system and our populace is how it is. There is an easier answer; one that is not unique to our country. That answer is people. When almost any number of people are gathered, consensus is hard to find. For example: ask any group of 3-5 people where the group is going to eat dinner. Back to politics, people vote for different reasons. Each individual's outlook on the country and their estimation of what is the more important issues facing the country vary wildly. The reality is that you aren't going to get millions of people to agree on much of anything. We might agree on lower taxes, but even then we'll argue about who needs to be paying more taxes so we can pay less. People are messy. It's just a fact of life.

Since the messiness of humanity is a reality, it has been clearly included in the Bible. God's wisdom has provided us in Holy Writ not only the divine instructions for obtaining salvation through grace and obedience, but also a window into the world for which Jesus died. The Bible shows flaws of mankind, sometimes in spades. Even the righteous figures of history who are included in the Bible have glaring holes in the fabric of their person, truly exhibiting for us what the Spirit said, when the Psalmist wrote:

"The LORD looks down from heaven upon the children of men, To see if there are any who understand, who seek God. They have all turned aside, They have together become corrupt; There is none who does good, No, not one." -Psalm 14:2-3

While God shows great grace and mercy and commends those who strive for a sound relationship with Him, He does not shy away from showing us all the of warts of humanity. Some of those warts are indecisiveness and an inability to agree on much of anything.

Another reason why perhaps people are difficult and messy is because they are uninformed. Everybody is entitled to their own opinion, even if it is one that has been formed with incorrect information or no real information at all. An uninformed opinion or knowledge doesn't prevent someone from talking and engaging in a movement. Take as an example the crowd who gathered in Ephesus after Demetrius riled up the craftsman and tried to set them against Paul and the Christians. If you'll remember a mob quickly manifested and things were so nutty the Bible says that "the assembly was confused, and most of them did not know why they had come together" (*Acts 19:32b*). A group of people is dangerous. A group of people who lack information and unity can be deadly.

The Lord's church should never be like that. The Lord's church should never be uninformed or disunified. God has given us His word and He expects us to collectively and individually read and study it (2 Tim 2:15). There should be no excuse for a lack of knowing what we should know, provided we have time to learn it (Heb 5:12-14). When it comes to unity, we are naturally different in many ways. We look, think, act, joke, feel, experience, and perceive life and data differently. Some are blessed in ways others are not and vice versa. Some struggle with various activities in the church and vice versa. The variance in our abilities, strengths, wisdom, and knowledge are a part of what makes the church so potent. A body doesn't function as well without all of its parts and

Paul said that the body of Christ is the same way (1 Cor 12:12-22). We are stronger together than we are apart (Eccl 4:9-12).

Through education from God's word and mutual edification, the church can use one voice. Paul rebuked and encouraged the Corinthian Christians to "speak the same thing" and wished they were "perfectly joined together in one mind" (1 Cor 1:10). He wasn't asking for them to agree on every discussion in the church that would ever arise. Do you think if they had carpets and song books in those days they would all have agreed on what color they needed to be? No. And that's not exactly the unity and singularity of mind that Paul is talking about (although there is certainly something to be said for personal sacrifice and grace where church opinion is concerned). The "one voice" is a divinely inspired foundation of doctrine, praise, and practice based upon the foundation of Jesus Christ and the inspired words of the Holy Spirit. When the church is separated and factious, it prevents such a "one voice" approach to worshipping God. Our goal is not to advance our opinions, but to advance praise and glory of God. The church is not a social club where we fight for supremacy; rather it is a family where we should fight for the lowest spot in order to serve. When we advance ourselves instead of God and are uninformed regarding God's missives, we put the unity of the body at risk. Toward the end of Paul's letter to the church at Rome he had this to say:

"We then who are strong ought to bear with the scruples of the weak, and not to please ourselves. Let each of us please his neighbor for his good, leading to edification... Now may the God of patience and comfort grant you to be like-minded toward one another, according to Christ Jesus, that you may with one mind and one mouth glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ." Romans 15:1-2, 5-6

Therein is our church mission explained in simple terms. We strive for knowledge, wisdom, and unity so that we can "with one voice" glorify God appropriately. Let's all look for ways to contribute and do our part so that we are promoting the one voice, not our voice (*Rom 12:3*).
