Remain True to the Doctrine

There are a multitude of philosophical, ideological, and religious doctrines that dot the landscape of our modern world. The perspective through which one views their environment, and summarily their place in it, is governed by which form of doctrine to which they cling. This can present difficulties for Christians attempting to reach these people and teach them the gospel. Even if we were to strip away any doctrinal schematics which have their foundation outside of the Bible, there is still such a pool of doctrines claiming to be Christian that it can be overwhelming. It is possible that people think what they're seeing is from God, when it's actually the work of the devil they're seeing. The adversary (1 Pet 5:8) is a liar and has been for thousands of years (Jn 8:44). We know that the devil wants to deceive people (Rev 12:9) and that he wants people as spiritually blind as possible (2 Cor 4:3-4). He has even gone to such extreme measures as to look like something good (2 Cor 11:14). Not only can Satan masquerade (NIV) as something godly, but Paul said that Satan's servants can do the same thing (2 Cor 11:15). That means someone can be working for the devil by teaching a doctrine that is similar to the one we have from God, but with changes that are detrimental for those who hear and believe it, resulting in their being destined for hell by doing so (2 Thess 1:7-9). Luke recorded an example of a type of misguided and failed belief; a man by the name of Simon had people convinced he had the power of God (Acts 8:9-11). Thank God they heard the true doctrine and believed it instead (Acts 8:12).

While some will be blinded from the true doctrine of God, some will accept it only to eventually lose it or turn from it. There are a couple of ways you can see this in the Bible. For one, the Jews had the doctrine of God (*Romans 3:1-2*), but they would not believe it. The Word of God, the Lord, lived among them and they refused to believe - even though their documents for hundreds of years had foretold His arrival. Another variation of this form is found in those who actually walked with Jesus; they didn't like or fully understand the message that He gave, so they simply left. Think about how powerful this is, that some of the individuals who were eyewitnesses of Jesus' teaching and miracles went from walking with Jesus to walking away from Him (*Jn 6:66*). A secondary form of leaving the doctrine of God is seen in more of a prophecy than a commentary. The apostle Paul wrote to the young evangelist Timothy and warned him of the fickleness of some who would allow their minds to be entertained with a new doctrine. He told him to:

"Preach the word! Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching. For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine, but according to their own desires, because they have itching ears, they will heap up for themselves teachers; and they will turn their ears away from the truth, and be turned aside to fables." -2 Timothy 4:2-4

The sad end for those who possess (and even believed and taught) the doctrine of God,

who then decide to leave, is eternal separation from God and the Lamb. The Bible says those who defect from God would have been better off to never have known God at all, than to have had an intimate relationship with Him and then forsake Him (2 Peter 2:21).

Perhaps you're reading this and you're thinking, "I'll never leave God or His doctrine." I hope that's true; I want that to be true and so does God (1 Tim 2:4). It is just here that I want to suggest a point of clarification: remaining true to the doctrine of God requires more than simply not defecting to another form of doctrine. We know that any deviation from the original doctrine from God is a perversion which cannot put us in a right relationship with God (Gal 1:6-9). There is only one "form" of doctrine that has been given to the world from God through His Son and Spirit (Rom 6:17; Jude 3). Continuing to believe the doctrine which came from God is one way of remaining true to that doctrine, but it is not the totality of it. Ultimately, to remain true to the doctrine of Christ is to believe it and live it (Phil 4:9). We can believe the doctrine of God without being true to it. Look at what Paul wrote to Timothy and Titus:

"Meditate on these things; give yourself entirely to them, that your progress may be evident to all. ¹⁶Take heed to yourself and to the doctrine. Continue in them, for in doing this you will save both yourself and those who hear you."

-1 Timothy 4:15-16

"Exhort bondservants to be obedient to their own masters, to be well pleasing in all things, not answering back, ¹⁰ not pilfering, but showing all good fidelity, that they may adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in all things." -Titus 2:9-10

If we are really going to remain true to the doctrine from God, we must believe it *and* live it. That means we embody the teachings of God and the Lord in how we act, dress, speak, think, and love. Remain true to the doctrine, because it is by our adherence to the doctrine that we will be judged (*Rev 20:12*).
