Be Ready

Did you hear about the local Procrastinator's Anonymous meeting? Something came up and they decided it was best to move the meeting to next week.

For many people it is simply easier to put off an activity or event until a later date. There is an old adage which says, "Don't put off until tomorrow what you can do today." The origination of the maxim is debatable, and coiners range from Benjamin Franklin and Mark Twain (19th century) to the Earl of Chesterfield in a letter to his son (18th century). Either way, the proverb is admirable and can affect a great deal in the life of those who would choose to enact such a positive approach to their lives. While that maxim is not in the Bible verbatim, it is absolutely present in various forms and shades. Solomon wrote that the sluggard should recalculate their approach to life and learn a lesson from the ant (*Prov 6:6-11*). The book of Proverbs exposes the foolishness of laziness in many passages, going so far as to say some are so lazy they won't even lift their hand to their mouth to eat (*Prov 19:24*). Laziness, idleness, indolence (and the like) are antithetical to biblical principles, wisdom, and even just plain 'ol natural common sense.

Procrastinators run the risk of kicking the can so far down the road they can no longer see it. Surely you've heard the phrase "kick the can down the road" in the arena of politics. It's a common phrase meant to attack oppositional representatives (or the body or party as a whole) when an agenda fails to include addressing pertinent issues and important changes to laws or patterns; choosing rather to avoid engagement with the issue(s) until a later date. If you'd like an example of such in our government think about how the national debt has grown exponentially since the early 2000s. Every administration has increased the national debt. The national debt increased from \$2.68 Trillion after Ronald Reagan to \$10.69 Trillion after George W. Bush and currently stands at a whopping \$34 Trillion dollar figure. It seems like Congress used to care about the national debt and would talk about instituting measures to address this runaway fiscal train which is accelerating to an almost certain undetermined and disastrous destination. However, it is merely something that our government, as constructed within the last twenty years, seems content to simply let future generations worry about. That's procrastination. And how!

As impactful as the US government's procrastination will be on future generations of Americans and how much the potential ramifications will reverberate throughout the global economy, there is a procrastination that means more, both in total value and in individuals affected. The pool of procrastinators is comprised by the Lord's church. We are the messengers of the gospel from the Lord; the hands and voices which present the invitation of God to a sinful humanity who need to be reconciled with their Maker. Let me direct you to the words of the apostle Paul as he makes the point in better language than I:

Page 2 Volume 31 Number 8

"Now thanks be to God who always leads us in triumph in Christ, and through us diffuses the fragrance of His knowledge in every place. ¹⁶For we are to God the fragrance of Christ among those who are being saved and among those who are perishing. ¹⁶To the one we are the aroma of death leading to death, and to the other the aroma of life leading to life. And who is sufficient for these things? ¹⁷For we are not, as so many, peddlingthe word of God; but as of sincerity, but as from God, we speak in the sight of God in Christ." -2 Corinthians 2:14-17

The imagery here is wonderfully constructed and easy to imagine. If you have ever seen an oil diffuser you already know the picture I am trying to explain. This device is a little bowl-shaped sort of container into which water is poured and then a few drops of oils are placed. The diffuser then expels a sort of steam from the top of the device and the smell of whatever scent of oil that was mixed into the water spreads through the room. That's you and me in the service of God. We are that container (2 Cor 4:7) into which God's truth has been instilled, and through whom the sense-altering effects of that "oil" of the truth of the gospel of Jesus is being spread through our environment.

Procrastination toward preparation is oppositional in life and as it relates to eternity. Procrastination toward preparation can negatively affect the soul of the procrastinator and the souls impacted by the procrastinator. A soul need not delay if they are ready to accept God's invitation and obey the gospel (Acts 22:16; 2 Cor 6:2). Likewise, a Christian need not delay when they are representing the Lord's body and diffusing God's message to the world (1 Pet 3:15). There are souls who exist in your worldly space that need you to diffuse the fragrance of Christ so they can smell it and act appropriately. Many will think the smell is terrible and hold their nose, reaping for themselves eternal condemnation (2 Thess 1:8-9). Some though will think the smell is lovely and get close to it, breathing it in, and finding peace and calm through its effects (Phil 4:4).

The Christian must needs be focused on preparing themselves to diffuse the truth by studying the word of God to the extent that they are properly diffusing it by both their manner of life and speech (2 Tim 2:15; Phil 2:15). We are poor servants of God if we are not prepared to diffuse the oil of the gospel:

"As vinegar to the teeth and smoke to the eyes, So is the lazy man to those who send him." -Proverbs 10:26

Imagine having the effect of smoke in the eyes of God because we are not prepared to share His truth with those surrounding us who need it. Be ready, not only to "give an answer," but to diffuse the scent of hope that the community around you needs so that they might be able to address the lack of spiritual security in their lives (2 Cor 5:20).
