## Don't Offer Something Lame

In our Wednesday night adult Bible class we have been discussing ways we can improve our personal Bible study. God has given us His word so that we could be guided (*In 16:13*), that we could avoid sin (*Psa 119:11*), and that we could be filled with hope (*Rom 5:5*). The revelation to John tells us that God wants us to hear and read His words (*Rev 1:3*). However, there is always more to devour and deeper to go in our

relationship with it. The depths of our understanding of God's word can never be filled; we cannot ever study the Bible to the point that we would be correct in assuming we had gleaned all that was possible. Since our goal cannot be a perfect and total acquisition of

God's wisdom, our goal then is progress (2 Tim 2:15).

As we progress in our comprehension, retention, and appreciation for God's word our application should increase accordingly. We know our application of God's word increases when we find ourselves more frequently asking the question the rich young ruler asked Jesus. He asked Jesus what was necessary for obtaining eternal life; Jesus answered that he should keep the commandments. However, the discussion went beyond just that answer:

"Jesus said, "You shall not murder,' You shall not commit adultery,' You shall not steal,' You shall not bear false witness,' 19 'Honor your father and your mother,' and, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' " 20 The young man said to Him, "All these things I have kept from my youth. What do I still lack?" -Matthew 19:18b-20

When we find ourselves asking, "What do I still lack" then we can be confident we are progressing in our heart and zeal for the Lord. We should continually shift our eyes and hearts from the earth to Heaven (*Col 3:1-2*) and mature in our understanding and implementation of God's instructions (2 *Tim 3:17*).

Our Bible study should change our lives. If your Bible study isn't changing your life, the fault lies either with you or your study, not with God's word (*Rom 1:16-17*). God's word is powerful enough to change hearts and the direction of feet. God's word is powerful enough to modify behaviors and break habits (*Col 3:9-10*). One area of improvement should be our worship.

To begin addressing our worship, let's focus on the occupation of the building. We only wish our pews were dirtier. Oh that our pews could have more people sit in them and the walls could reverberate with the voices that could fill our auditorium. Far too often our pews are too clean, and our walls echo rather than vibrate. It seems one of the perennial stresses of church life is the church actually being a part of church life. The Lord's church has existed for very nearly 2,000 years and has the entire time fought against complacency and unfaithfulness in attendance. We know this through personal experience, extra-biblical writings, and the Holy text itself. According to the Hebrews writer, the church has struggled with empty seats since the first century:

Page 2 Volume 31 Number 10

"Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful. "And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, "not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching."

#### -Hebrews 10:23-25

It seems that frequent exhortation, challenge, motivation, pleading, and even shaming has its limitations. Only personal Bible study that manifests change in someone's life can increase attendance in the assembly.

In addition to being present in the worship service, we should consider the aspect of actually being present. There's a difference between being in the church building and participating in worship and praise with the rest of the church. If someone thinks or says, "I didn't get anything out of the service today" it is possible that the lesson wasn't very good. It is possible the song selections were not all upbeat and inspiring. It is possible some people had "off days" and were not as friendly as usual. However, none of those things overshadow the very reason for worship and they are highly likely excuses masking the real problem- the person who didn't "get" anything out didn't really "put" anything in. If we are in the building, but not actively engaged, we could be guilty of offering God lame worship. We use the word *lame* differently in the 21<sup>st</sup> century than the same word applied to biblical text, but allow me the connection for a moment and read from Malachi:

""A son honors his father, And a servant his master. If then I am the Father, Where is My honor? And if I am a Master, Where is My reverence? Says the LORD of hosts To you priests who despise My name. Yet you say, 'In what way have we despised Your name?' "You offer defiled food on My altar, But say, 'In what way have we defiled You?' By saying, "The table of the LORD is contemptible.' And when you offer the blind as a sacrifice, Is it not evil? And when you offer the lame and sick, Is it not evil?

Offer it then to your governor! Would he be pleased with you? Would he accept you favorably?" Says the LORD of hosts." "
-Malachi 1:6-8

You can see how the *lame* here is literally referring to a lame animal rather than an adjective for the type of worship given. But the two words work well together. When God delivered instructions outlining humanity's worship practices, He demanded the best of man's offering (*Lev 4:32*). If we are giving God what is left over we are not close to the firstfruits (our best). If we are only feigning allegiance and love, we are offering God unacceptable worship. If we are only superficially worshipping the Almighty, we are offering Him lame worship. God gave us His best, literally a part of Himself (*Phil 2:5-6*). Let's give God our best in daily life; in worship on

Sunday; and in our attitude, appearance, energy,
