Last Sunday morning's worship service welcomed a number of visitors. Some of them might attend again and some might not. Regrettably, some of them might not visit again until December. The reason being that the majority of the religious "year" has for centuries been dominated by two specific days: Easter and Christmas. There are some churches in our world that have what is called "clout." A 21<sup>st</sup> century version of that word might be related to the power or affect an "influencer" can have. One of these churches is so powerful that even the local Sonic Drive-In will serve fish sandwiches during a certain time of year. While one might assume it is always a good thing when a religious group has an impact on the world and the name of God is promoted, it's concerning when the name of God is being promoted in methods and voices that are not controlled by or authorized by God. The influence of that one particular religion might even be why some people assume that "as long as I take communion" one's Sunday worship to God is fulfilled. The elevation of one part of the worship service over another and of one Sunday over the others is a restriction of the reverence owed to God and the commemoration of the sacrifice of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

The 2024 iteration of Easter was a hotbed of trouble. The particular Sunday on which the mainstream religious world observed Easter fell on March 31. Unbeknownst to me, March 31<sup>st</sup> also happens to be the day when awareness is given to those in the population of our country who consider themselves as transgender (or gender non-conforming). I was unaware of the day's tie to this portion of our population; I was especially unaware that this day has been used by various peoples to focus on this group since 2009. There was an (understandable) highly combustible kerfuffle this year when the "Transgender Visibility Day" happened to fall on the same day as Easter (viewed by many as a 'high holy day' of Christianity). Why did Easter fall on March 31<sup>st</sup>? If you are anything like me, you never know when Easter is going to be. Honestly, I did not even realize Easter was coming until I received a phone call in the church office recently and someone asked if the upcoming Sunday was Easter. Easter never semes to fall on the same Sunday. Maybe you know some about Easter, but not a lot. Let's fix that.

Easter is, according to Encyclopedia Britannica, the "principal festival of the Christian church"; it goes on to record that "the earliest recorded observance of an Easter celebration comes from the 2<sup>nd</sup> century." It has been concluded that our English word "Easter" comes from unknown origin. Bede (8th century AD) conjectured that it came from "Eostre/Eostrae...the name of the Anglo-Saxon goddess of spring and fertility," while another suggestion is that it came from the Old German word meaning "east" which itself derived from a Latin word meaning "dawn." The reality is we have no real idea as to the origin and development of our English word. We do, however (and thankfully), know where the word for certain festival and high days in the Bible come from. For instance, the only time you'll see the word "Easter" in your Bibles is in one translation in one place, Acts 12:4. In that text, Luke was writing about the time at which Herod was planning to bring Peter out before the Jews and presumably offer him the same reception he had just offered James (death). In that text, the word in the Greek is *pascha*. That word is used 29 times in the NT and is translated every other time as "Passover." The word's origin is Aramaic in form (pesach) and is used 49 times in the OT (also rendered as "Passover"). In history, an Easter celebration has been observed at varying times. At one point, it was observed two days after the Jews celebrated the Passover, which would make it the 16<sup>th</sup> day of the month Nisan (our March-April) whether that fell on a Sunday or not. Others celebrated it on the first day of the week, regardless of where the other day fell, because Jesus was raised on the first day of the

week. A notable council declared in AD325 that it should be observed on the first Sunday following the full moon after the Spring equinox. Therefore, it is celebrated anywhere from March 22<sup>nd</sup> to April 25<sup>th</sup> (which is why none of us can remember when Easter is). Through the ages, Easter has morphed into a holiday where bunnies, eggs, and chocolate have dominated the commercial aspect of this day, and pictures are taken with nice new clothes-in our neck of the woods these often take place in patches of bluebonnets.

But Easter is over. Or is it? It is true that "Easter Sunday" is over as far as the broader religious world is concerned. Grandma has been visited, eggs have been hidden and found (mostly), and pictures in new dresses and suits have been taken. For some people their obligatory or customary one-of-two appearances in church are finished for the year. For the Lord's church though, today is still the Lord's Day and we still are celebrating and commemorating His resurrection from that stony tomb. Remember that the English word "Easter" is really "Passover." Let us not miss the relation of that word to Jesus the Lord, because the Holy Spirit inspired the apostle Paul to record that Christ was something special:

"Your glorying is not good. Do you not know that a little leaven leavens the whole lump? Therefore purge out the old leaven, that you may be a new lump, since you truly are unleavened. For indeed Christ, our Passover, was sacrificed for us. Therefore let us keep the feast, not with old leaven, nor with the leaven of malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth."

#### -1 Corinthians 5:5-8

Christians do not observe the Passover in the Jewish sense, but we do commemorate the feast initiated and commanded on the night Jesus ate the Passover meal with His disciples. Jesus took some unleavened bread and said to:

"'Take, eat; this is My body.' Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, 'Drink from it, all of you. "For this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins. "But I say to you, I will not drink of this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it new with you in My Father's kingdom."

### -Matthew 26:26b-29

That meal impresses upon us the sacrifice of the Lord, the blessing of communing with Him at God's table, and implied within must be the power of God in the resurrection of Jesus- because the Bible teaches us that the salvation from God came through the Lord's death, burial, and resurrection. Paul said that if we only have hope in this life and if there were no resurrection that we would all still be in sin, and we'd be eternally hopeless (1 Cor 15:16-19). The apostle Paul also gave instructions as how to properly observe the Lord's Supper in chapter 11 of that same book. Therein, he said the Lord taught Him that we are partaking of that meal "in remembrance" of Jesus and that we are "proclaiming the Lord's death until He comes" (11:26). The "until He comes" only makes sense because God the Father raised Jesus from the dead. Every Sunday, not just a single one sometime in March or April, we should herald and remember the sacrifice, humiliation, death, and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. Some people might celebrate Jesus' victory over the grave on that one special day each year, but the Bible invites us to celebrate it every first day of the week when we assemble before the Almighty and commune with Him- a blessing afforded to us only because the Lord died and rose again (1 Pet 1:21; Heb 10:19-22).
