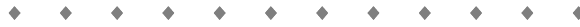

Can You Do What He Did?

We generally tend to “look up to” certain people in this world. We respect and often try to model our own behavior after these people. We might refer to them as mentors, teachers, or heroes. They possess and exhibit positive qualities we desire to emulate. Sometimes it might be possible that a person is being examined and emulated while completely unawares. Such compels us to monitor our behavior because there just might be someone looking up to us while unbeknownst to us. I remember being told when I was younger that I had a cousin who was watching me and aware of what I did. The lesson that was intended for me then was to be careful with what I did and said, because someone else was listening, watching, and learning. You never know when someone might try to do the things you do.

Christians also engage in this enterprise. There are Christians who are examples to the church in knowledge, wisdom, generosity, activity, and dedication. Sometimes this can cause consternation on behalf of the one watched because of the extra attention paid and the feeling of needing to “live up to” the standard. Other times it might cause disappointment or even disillusionment with the church on behalf of the person watching because their “hero” might sin occasionally and fail them. People are not perfect and should not be our preferred image of duplication. That honor and responsibility falls only on the shoulders of the Savior, Jesus (*Phil 2:5*). He alone can stand up to the test of time and our constant attention.

Our Lord left His position of sovereignty and rule over the world He created to be born into that world of sinful humanity (*Phil 2:6-7*). He accepted a mission which subjected Him to the dangers, struggles, and stresses of life on the Earth (*Heb 2:17-18*). A poor young woman was tasked with protecting and raising Him from a tiny human until the time came He would become the proclaimer of an open door to the imminent kingdom of God (*Matt 4:17*). Jesus lived on this earth in poverty and virtual anonymity (*Jn 1:26*). He performed miracles and garnered so much attention that He was mobbed frequently with desires and infirmities of mankind in dire straits (*Mk 1:45*). He was loved by many, criticized by others, and hated by the leaders of the day (*Lk 19:14*). He remained on the path to the completion of His mission, His death for the world (*Phil 2:8*). He was delivered to that death by one of His personal companions (*Matt 26:48*). He then acquiesced to the judgments of His combatants and accepted the punishment of the cross, dying there, suspended between heaven and earth, for all of mankind (*Lk 23:46*).

If we read that (incomplete) list of Jesus’ accomplishments and activities we would readily respond with a resounding “NO,” we cannot do what He did. There are elements of the life of Jesus though that we can adopt, duplicate, and execute in our own lives. Read the following text, which outlined some of the horrible things done to Jesus:

“But He kept silent and answered nothing. Again the high priest asked Him, saying to Him, “Are You the Christ, the Son of the Blessed?”⁶² Jesus said, “I am. And you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Power, and coming with the clouds of heaven.”⁶³ Then the high priest tore his clothes and said,

“What further need do we have of witnesses?⁹ “You have heard the blasphemy! What do you think?” And they all condemned Him to be deserving of death. “Then some began to spit on Him, and to blindfold Him, and to beat Him, and to say to Him, “Prophesy!” And the officers struck Him with the palms of their hands.” -**Mark 14:61-65**

Have you ever read that text and imagined yourself being with Him on that day and wanting to run up to them to stop them and defend Him? Do you know what Jesus would do if it were possible? Very likely, He would have told you what He told Peter when he pulled and swung his sword at the head of the high priest’s servant- Stop!

The purpose for asking and answering the question “Can you do what He did,” is to point to a text written by the Apostle Peter. In this text he outlines not only what Jesus did, but how Jesus did it. Read a little section of Peter’s letter:

“But when you do good and suffer, if you take it patiently, this is commendable before God. ²¹For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps: ²² “Who committed no sin, Nor was deceit found in His mouth”; ²³who, when He was reviled, did not revile in return; when He suffered, He did not threaten, but committed Himself to Him who judges righteously; ²⁴who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness-by whose stripes you were healed.” -1 **Peter 2:20b-24**

Look specifically at verse twenty-four: Jesus didn’t respond in kind when abused. None of us have been treated as horribly as Jesus. None of us have been disrespected or attacked like Jesus. None of us have ever endured such unfair situations as Jesus. Yet, all too often we might struggle with how we respond when we are poorly treated. Jesus didn’t give in and use unfair or harsh treatment as an excuse to act ungodly; neither should we. Can we do what He did? We should try (*1 Jn 2:6*).


