Trash Belongs Outside

Every Tuesday we're supposed to have our trash bin by the street, along with any extra bags of trash we may have accumulated during the week. The city of Killeen's waste management team comes by without fail and removes the things from our house that we don't want. Most trash in American homes is probably common-food; packaging; paper products; vacuum or dustpan contents; and containers from the local Taco Bell, Dominoes, or Starbucks. In an article focused on the progression and evolution of trash in America up to the year of 2018, the EPA reported that "the total generation of MSW (municipal solid waste) in 2018 was 292.3 million tons, which was approximately 23.7 million tons more than the amount generated in 2017." This portion of our article is not to discuss the growth in waste, but to be astounded at the sheer gargantuan volume of our trash. It wasn't 292 million pounds, but tons; that means the total waste amounted to over 584 billion pounds of trash. To put that into some perspective, that means all of our trash gathered weighs over one and a half million times more than the Empire State Building.

Have you ever been to a landfill? If not, imagine a trash bag into which has been put the leftovers you forgot to eat that got pushed to the back of the fridge and then multiply that times a bunch. Trash goes outside for a reason; it's dirty, smelly, and simply waste. Surely you wouldn't go around the city of Killeen emptying out other peoples' trash bins and taking that trash home would you? I don't envision any of us opening up our front doors and plopping bags of trash beside the sofa like end tables or kicking up our feet on them as footstools. But what if we were, unknowingly?

The trash of the world is everywhere and too often we bring it inside just like we would the letters the postal worker places in our mailbox. From billboards and gas stations to malls, schools, back alleys, and the internet- the trash of the world is always within reach. What makes this trash dangerous to us is that we often don't recognize it as trash immediately. We might think something is benign and let ourselves get close to it, enough even to become enamored with it and, thus, have a hard time putting it down. Usually though we can recognize what's bad for us and distasteful and keep it at arm's length. Some of the most potent trash in our world is not trash that we can notice outside our homes, but the trash we willfully and habitually bring in.

God wants us to keep dangerous things as far away from our homes as we can. In the book of Deuteronomy, Moses instructed the second generation of wilderness-wanderers to stay close to God. He told them that they were expected to love God with all of their being and to talk of God's precepts and laws inside their homes and to ensure their homes were places that honored and proclaimed God. God told His people through Moses that they would be blessed if they would listen to and heed His words. Look at this text where Moses talks about the lengths to which they should go to protect themselves:

"And the LORD your God will drive out those nations before you little by little; you will be unable to destroy them at once, lest the beasts of the field become too numerous for you. 28 But the LORD your God will deliver them over to you, and will inflict defeat upon them until they are destroyed. 24 And He will deliver their kings into your hand, and you will destroy their name from under heaven; no one shall be able to stand against you until you have destroyed them. 25 You shall burn the carved images of their gods with fire; you shall not covet the silver or gold that is on them, nor take it for yourselves, lest you be snared by it; for it is an abomination to the LORD your God. 26 Nor shall you bring an abomination into your house, lest you be doomed to destruction like it. You shall utterly detest it and utterly abhor it, for it is an accursed thing." -Deuteronomy 7:22-26

Notice that, not only did Moses warn them about this "trash", but he also said not to bring it into their homes. What about your home?

The times are different, but the message from God is the same. You and I have a responsibility to protect our own souls and those of our families from the "trash" that is out there. John wrote that the church should keep themselves from idols (1 Jn 5:21). Paul wrote that the church should stay away from every appearance of evil (1 Thess 5:22). Not only should we be constantly aware of the danger of sin and evil as we venture out into the world, but this klaxon should blare in our ears as we think about what kind of media, music, attitudes, influences, and products come through the front doors of our home (*Eph 5:15-17*).
