Regions Round About Illyricum

This past week I was watching one of my favorite Disney movies. The movie, starring Dennis Quaid, is a story about a middle-aged teacher and baseball coach in West Texas. He had always loved baseball and even got a shot to play higher level ball after high school, but he experienced a litany of arm injuries and had to give it up. One day, serving in his capacity as baseball coach, he was lecturing his team on having dreams so they would wind up truly getting something out of life. He told them that most of them would finish high school, get a local job, and probably retire and spend the rest of their lives in that same little Texas town where they were sitting. For some people, that is their future. They are born into a small town, attend school, find a job working locally, get married to a girl they met in high school and settle down in that town until they're old. Some people move around more though; sitting still just isn't in their bones. This is the type of person I believe the apostle Paul was (*Acts 26:11-13*).

When you read of Paul's quick conversation with a Roman commander in Acts 21, you find out that he was a good way from home. The commander didn't know who Paul was or why the Jews were so angry with him and, in order to preserve Paul's life, he had him rescued from the Jewish mob. As Paul requested a moment to talk to him he revealed that he was originally from Tarsus in Cilicia (*Acts 21:39*). Tarsus was the capital of Cilicia and was on the southwestern coast of Asia Minor (modern Turkey). Paul was a long way from home that day in Jerusalem. When you read more about the apostle Paul you find out he was a world-traveler. The reason he was in Jerusalem at that time was a return to that Jewish world-center for Pentecost (*Acts 20:16*) and to give a gift to the saints (*Acts 24:17-18*). He had been far away from Jerusalem working for the Lord on one of his many missionary journeys. The apostle Paul would ultimately travel through a large portion of Asia Minor and to places such as Cyprus, Macedonia, Greece, and Rome. Paul worked feverishly for the Lord in attempt to warn and teach to every man about Christ Jesus (*Col 1:28*).

While on his well-established missionary journeys, Paul would write letters to various churches of Christ. We call these letters "epistles", and they comprise a large portion of our New Testament. Paul wrote to the Lord's church at Ephesus, Philippi, Colossae, Thessalonica, Corinth, the regions of Galatia, and Rome. It is to a portion of his letter to the Roman Church of Christ I direct your attention. Notice what the apostle Paul says regarding his work and his mindset:

"Now I myself am confident concerning you, my brethren, that you also are full of goodness, filled with all knowledge, able also to admonish one another. ¹⁶ Nevertheless, brethren, I have written more boldly to you on *some* points, as reminding you, because of the grace given to me by God, ¹⁶ that I might be a minister of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles, ministering the gospel of God, that the offering of the Gentiles might be acceptable, sanctified by the Holy Spirit. ¹⁷ Therefore I have reason to glory in Christ Jesus in the things *which pertain* to Page 2

God. ¹⁸ For I will not dare to speak of any of those things which Christ has not accomplished through me, in word and deed, to make the Gentiles obedient-¹⁹ in mighty signs and wonders, by the power of the Spirit of God, so *that from Jerusalem and round about to Illyricum* I have fully preached the gospel of Christ. ²⁰ And so I have made it my aim to preach the gospel, not where Christ was named, lest I should build on another man's foundation, ²¹ but as it is written: 'To whom He was not announced, they shall see; And those who have not heard shall understand.' "**-Romans 15:14-21** (emphasis mine)

The apostle mentioned here the extent of the work which he had accomplished for the Lord and the church. He implied here that others had not traveled as far as he had yet. We know where Jerusalem was, but what about Illyricum? The region of Illyricum was a province on the northwestern corner of Asia Minor, situated north of Macedonia and east of Italy, just across the Adriatic Sea. We might assume then that Paul was doing a work of biblical and spiritual training that others might have been engaged in, but in an area far removed from common travel of other Christians.

Most of us will not travel outside of our country to preach and teach the gospel. Most of us will not travel out of our state to preach the gospel and serve the Lord. That likelihood, however, does not preclude us from assisting the work of the church by the hands and voices of those who are engaged in such a globe-traversing enterprise. We can fulfill the Great Commission of our Lord (*Matt* 28:19-20; *Mk* 16:15-16) at home, but we can also engage in cooperation with those who are taking that commission globally. Consider, as you have opportunity and God has blessed you, to support with your prayers, service, and finances those who are taking God's word to the lost living beyond the border of our country (1 Cor 15:58). 
