God Wants Me to Go Where?!

Do you pray for our United States? If you do, for what do you pray? The Holy Spirit, through the apostle Paul, instructed us to pray for our government and her leaders (1 Tim 2:1-3). The Spirit also, through Peter, encouraged us to honor those in positions of power and to be submissive (1 Pet 2:13-17). Sometimes that can be difficult because we might not agree with the direction the country seems headed and we might not like the policies that are promoted and passed into law. Perhaps we look around and wonder how so many people are so far away from God and His virtues. We want to pray for more godly policies to be introduced and enacted and for more politicians who care about the Bible and believe in God. We might pray for more hearts to be willing to accept the truth and obey the gospel. If you pray for that, do you realize that the pathway to more people obeying the truth might possibly stem from worse financial and social conditions than exist now? It can be that dark times breed a humility and openness to the word of God that is absent when things are good.

If we borrow that same idea, perhaps we might apply it to the areas in which we evangelize. While it should be the case that we take advantage of every opportunity which is presented in which to evangelize, it may very well be that better success is found among those who have more problems, less money, and greater insecurity in life. In fact it was the poor who were mentioned by James (in contrast to the rich) as those God has chosen to "be rich in faith" (*Jms 2:5*). As the Lord's church, we want people to come to us, through our doors, and hear the word of God and be moved by it; but sometimes the church has to leave our comfortable places and go to the uncomfortable.

God's word gives us an excellent example for this train of thought. The 1st century servant Philip was among seven men who were chosen to facilitate the physical work of the church when the Hellenistic Jews complained about mistreatment (*Acts 6:5-6*). This servant is mentioned again just two chapters later. When we read of him that next time, he has departed Jerusalem and traveled to Samaria to spread the word of God. The way the text portrays the work in Samaria was that Philip was wildly successful in his ministry. He has taken the word of God and with it turned people away from the charlatan Simon whom they thought had the power of God. In fact, Philip was so successful that he converted the charlatan too! The work of the church in Samaria was going great. Then came a day when Philip was told to leave it (*Acts 8:26*).


Philip went from the populated area where Bible study and conversions were numerous, to a desert road and a place far away. Look at the text:

"Now an angel of the Lord spoke to Philip, saying, 'Arise and go toward the south along the road which goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.' This is desert. "So he arose and went. And behold, a man of Ethiopia, a eunuch of great authority under Candace the queen of the Ethiopians, who had charge of all her treasury, and had come to Jerusalem to worship, "swas returning. And sitting in his chariot, he was reading Isaiah the prophet." Then the Spirit said to Philip, 'Go near and overtake this chariot." -Acts 8:26-29

Note that Luke completes the message from the Spirit to Philip and then includes a narrative note that "this is desert." According to a map and ancient passageways, this was a specific road that existed between Jerusalem and Gaza that was a route back toward Egypt (so likewise, Ethiopia) from Jerusalem. The Greek word can indicate a waste place and also very sparsely populated area. So we might conclude that the Holy Spirit took Philip away from a populated area where many were being converted and sent him into a deserted area to teach just one man who was on his way out of the country to a far-away land. The text doesn't indicate that Philip questioned it or balked; rather simply that he complied. I wonder if any of us in that situation would have had second thoughts about where we were being sent. Here on this "desert road" toward Gaza, a long way from Jerusalem and even further from the evangelical boomtown of Samaria, Philip taught this Ethiopian eunuch the gospel- and he obeyed quickly (Acts 8:34-38)!

We never know what ears and hearts might be softened by the word of God. Surely there are some people of whom we might think twice before we evangelize to them. For instance, Ananias balked when God told him to seek out the Pharisee named Saul (Acts 9:13). Ananias essentially told God, "You know who this is right? You know what he has done to your people and what he could do to me?" However apprehensive Ananias might have been, he went, and Saul was converted (Acts 22:16). That same Saul (known to us as the Apostle Paul) penned about half of our New Testament by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Let us always be ready to give an answer for our hope (1 Pet 3:15) and always be ready to share the gospel with anyone and everyone (Eph 6:15) because every single soul around us needs the gospel and the Lord's blood. Our job as servants is to spread that message to any person, with any background, in any part of a town or country, who might be willing to humble themselves before God and find the salvation only He can offer and supply (1 Tim 2:4).
