And Away They Go

This month is going to be challenging for some of our members. August is the month when young men and young women all over our country depart the familiar (and possibly even seemingly confining) environments of home and march into the world on their own. They have lived under the rules of others for their entire lives and are about to be free to make their own decision, each and every one for which they will be singularly responsible. The pressure of making their own decisions, and the implications of being solely responsible for their livelihood, is likely not at the forefront of their mind right now. They are likely filled with anticipation, excitement, anxious energy, hopefulness, joy, wonder, imagination, and a revving urge to step out and be an adult. While there are a lot of exciting changes and wonderful experiences on the way for all of them, it would do them well to remember that their soul is their most valuable possession and

being a faithful Christian is their most worthwhile endeavor in life (Mk 8:34-38).

This month is going to be challenging for more than just those young students or young professionals. The home they're leaving is about to change in unknown, unrealized, and unalterable ways. The families who heard that first cry so many years ago are going to be forced to do something they might not be ready to do: let go. Someone that has meant so much to you for so many years, a part of your identity, is leaving. Suddenly, your mind starts to flood with memories. My wife and I were not sure we would even get to see our oldest son. Not long into her pregnancy she had a medical emergency, and we had a rushed trip to the ER one night with our hearts not sure what news would await us. While in the hospital room, there it was- the little heart was still beating. About five or six months later, we were back in a hospital. This time it was because my wife's body couldn't handle being pregnant anymore and it would put her life in danger for her to be pregnant any longer. So, there we were, married for a little over a year, both in our early 20's, and about to meet our first baby a good bit earlier than we wanted to. I remember crying with her when I heard him cry for the first time; but those tears of iov were soon replaced by fear and sheer helplessness. His little lungs weren't fully developed, and he couldn't take a complete breath. The hospital where he was born wasn't capable of caring for his needs, so he had to be transported by ambulance about 60 miles north. There, he found some help in the facility that would care for him in their NICU for the next almost two weeks while we stayed in the Ronald McDonald House (a great place to support if you ever have the chance). He had a strained and stressful entry into this world and, Lord willing, it is still only the beginning.

The evolution from child to adult is likely one most parents never truly understand is happening until does. We realize that the little things in life, which we overlooked in the hustled flow of life all those years, suddenly seem like the things we'll miss the most. Perhaps parents question the mistakes they've made through the years. More than anything though, there is a realization that this is the natural way of the world. We're not born to stay babies; we're born to mature and mean something to this world. Such is the information given to us by the Preacher:

"To everything *there is* a season, A time for every purpose under heaven: ²A time to be born, And a time to die; A time to plant And a time to pluck *what is* planted; ³A time to kill, And a time to heal; A time to break down, And a time to build up; ⁴A time to weep, And a time to laugh; A time to mourn, And a time to dance; ⁵A time to cast away stones, And a time to gather stones; A time to embrace, And a time to refrain from embracing; ⁶A time to gain, And a time to lose; A time to keep, And a time to throw away; ⁷A time to


