Ask God First

I wonder how many of us have ever played *Mother May I*. What about *Simon Says*? These are both essentially playground games that were popular in the 1900s, though it is likely they have fallen out of style or even out of popular knowledge this millennium. In both games one must gain authority before they can act; if they don't, they're negatively impacted and might lose the game.

Life is not a game.

However, some of the same principles of those games might apply in life. One must act within the proper authority or suffer the repercussions. As a child one needs parental authority to engage in even the tiniest activities. Throughout the maturation process of a child they are taught (or should be taught) that their parents' authority is supreme in the house and that ultimately, decisions are relegated to the parental units in the house (*Eph 6:1-2*). You might have cases where dad is asked a question and his answer is, "Go ask your mother," but even there the question-preceding-the-action principle is still at work.

Secondarily, where you can lose a game, you can most definitely lose life. If improper or unapproved activities are practiced, they can lead to consequences. Some consequences carry perhaps only a small amount of pain or complication, but some are life-altering or potentially life ending. Both of these situations are heightened when the focus shifts toward the spiritual realm. If one acts without proper authority and violates principles of obedience spiritually the consequences are dire.

Doing what you want comes at a great cost. There is a phrase which some jokingly use to govern their activities in life where they highlight what they want which others might put at risk. That phrase is, "It's better to ask for forgiveness than permission." This phrase is a tongue-in-cheek way of saying that the individual would rather go ahead and do something that might be wrong (or just disliked) and ask for forgiveness later than they would ask for permission and possibly be told no. The phrase really means that the individual wants to do what they want regardless. Such might be the way one looks at some relationships, but that is never how one should act or think with God.

God has the ultimate authority. Whether we agree or not, God is in charge. Whether we submit or not, God is in charge. Regardless of what conclusions we might have drawn and assumptions we may create, we should still defer to God. Mankind sometimes is too smart for his own good. Earthly wisdom and pride can cloud a great many minds, even spiritual ones; even godly people can sometimes jump at a task without first taking their situation to God.

God's people haven't always made good decisions. There is a text in the OT that highlights the dangers which lurk nearby when people don't approach God before they

act. The background for this event was an aging judge and a budding one. Eli was old and he had not been a very good example of a godly father (1 Sam 2:29-31). Samuel had been offered to God by his mother, Hannah, and was recipient of the words of God (1 Sam 3:21). It was during this time that Israel was threatened with the advances of their frequent enemy- the Philistines. When the Philistines attacked, a good number of Israelites fell. After the defeat the Israelites thought maybe they should take "God" into battle with them. The problem was, they didn't ask God if they could take what they took. Look what happened:


"And when the people had come into the camp, the elders of Israel said, "Why has the Lord defeated us today before the Philistines? Let us bring the ark of the covenant of the Lord from Shiloh to us, that when it comes among us it may save us from the hand of our enemies." 4So the people sent to Shiloh, that they might bring from there the ark of the covenant of the Lord of hosts, who dwells between the cherubim... So the Philistines fought, and Israel was defeated, and every man fled to his tent. There was a very great slaughter, and there fell of Israel thirty thousand foot soldiers. "Also the ark of God was captured; and the two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, died." -1 Samuel 4:3-4; 10-11

They didn't approach God. They didn't ask God. They merely appropriated God's ark (and approval) and assumed they knew what they should do.

The repercussions of acting without God's consultation and approval are disastrous. We must war against jumping to an activity without consulting God first- through His word (2 Tim 3:17) and prayer (Phil 4:6-7).
