Thanksgiving

If you're one of those people who cannot wait until it's "pumpkin spice" season, then you're now allowed to go wild. If you go to HEB, Target, or Walmart, you are likely to be inundated with pumpkin spice flavored everything, and I do mean everything (did you know they made pumpkin spice Cheerios and English muffins?). I'm sure those of you who are "pumpkin heads" have already planned or maybe even already have partaken of the latest drink from Starbucks. This time of year brings many favorite foods and spices to our palates and noses. It also heralds the season that so many look forward to in November- Thanksgiving. At that feast there will be turkey, green bean casserole, dressing (or stuffing, come on, let's not argue about what we call it), deviled eggs, gravy, rolls, sweet potato casserole, and pumpkin and pecan pie. Many people will meet with family or friends and enjoy a meal that we likely will take for granted.

Thanksgiving should not be a 'season' or a 'meal' but a lifestyle. The word "thanksgiving" is found in the Bible 40 times; but the attitude surely occurs more frequently. God has given us everything in life, including life itself (*Gen 1:27*). Even those who do not know, or refuse to know God, have been given everything by God (*Acts 17:25; Jms 1:17*). It should hurt our hearts that God has so graciously provided us with life, blessings, care, and joyful experiences in life and yet very few people actually give Him credit, glory, or even acknowledgement (*Lk 17:17-18*).

Millennia ago there was a feast that commemorated all of the wonderful things God had provided for His people. Look at what Moses delivered to the ancient Hebrews:

"And the Lord spoke to Moses, saying, "Speak to the children of Israel, and say to them: "When you come into the land which I give to you, and reap its harvest, then you shall bring a sheaf of the firstfruits of your harvest to the priest. "He shall wave the sheaf before the Lord, to be accepted on your behalf; on the day after the Sabbath the priest shall wave it. "And you shall offer on that day, when you wave the sheaf, a male lamb of the first year, without blemish, as a burnt offering to the Lord. "Its grain offering *shall be* two-tenths *of an ephah* of fine flour mixed with oil, an offering made by fire to the Lord, for a sweet aroma; and its drink offering *shall be* of wine, one-fourth of a hin. "You shall eat neither bread nor parched grain nor fresh grain until the same day that you have brought an offering to your God; *it shall be* a statute forever throughout your generations in all your dwellings." "Leviticus 23:9-14

The Father had blessed them with grain and produce and they were offering Him the first of all they had in gratitude for all of His wondrous providence. This feast predated the feast we know as Pentecost by seven sabbaths (*Lev 23:15-16*). This feast seems to have been on the day following a Sabbath (*Lev 23:15*). This is interesting since Jesus is called "firstfruits" (*Rom 11:16; 1 Cor 15:20, 23*) and He was raised on Sunday morning, the day following a Sabbath.

We don't observe such a feast today. We do "lay by in store" on the first day of

the week in obedience of the Bible's instruction and with respect and praise for all that God has done for us (1 Cor 16:1-2; 2 Cor 9:7-11). The Christian is expected to live thanksgiving, not just observe it one day a year because an old President declared it so. We are to eat with thanksgiving (1 Tim 4:4), pray with thanksgiving (Phil 4:6), fellowship with thanksgiving (2 Cor 9:16); evangelize with thanksgiving (2 Cor 2:14); praise with thanksgiving (Rev 7:12), and look forward to eternal hope with thanksgiving (1 Cor 15:57).

Thanksgiving should be a day to fellowship, feast, remember, praise, give gratitude, serve, and praise God for allowing us the opportunity to do all of that and much more. Thanksgiving should be more than one day. While you work up to doing this all year, at least consider trying to do this throughout November: write down some notes that you can work off of and build throughout the month and try to thank God specifically and purposefully for some blessing in your life every day through the month. See how many things you can realize God has blessed you with and see what acknowledging that does to your mind (*Psalm* 69:30; 116:17).
