The Least Pitiable

There are pitiful and pitiable people, as well as situations, in life. We might not always use these words in agreement with the primary dictionary definition. For instance, if a baseball team only scores two runs per game or a football team fails to make it to the Super Bowl for over a decade, the fans might say that performance is "pitiful." The word pitiful can technically reference something small, but its primary connotation is "arousing pity," which is "the feeling of sorrow and compassion caused by the suffering and misfortunes of others." One can experience this almost anywhere. From driving by the person sitting on the street corner to watching commercials on the television which broadcast the plight of starving or malady-afflicted children in far reaches of the globe, unfortunate situations are viewed frequently.

Sometimes we even feel pity for ourselves. Perhaps it is only human nature to want some attention occasionally. Likely you bear a heavy burden in your life in your roles as spouse, parent, or caregiver. Maybe your job takes an exorbitant amount of your time and ladens you with stress. Surely, if you are the primary individual in charge of your household, you have a list of things that never seems to get smaller, and nobody ever really asks how you are feeling until you begin to physically break down from exhaustion. From time to time we want people to notice us, to care about us and for us, and to have some pity for our stress, our physical depletion, and our constant burden. If not, we might just revert to childlike behavior and have ourselves a good 'ol "pity party".

There is, however, a greater pity that can be experienced in our world. The highest form of pity is in reference to those whose entire lives and identities are bound up in vanity. If a truth enacted by the power of God weren't really true, Christians would be the ones who should receive it. Let me explain. The apostle Paul wrote to the Lord's church in Corinth, apparently needing to respond to some people who were under the mistaken impression or perverted belief that there was no resurrection of the dead. Paul explains that for the Christian life to mean anything, resurrection from the dead *must* be possible. Look at the text:

"Now if Christ is preached that He has been raised from the dead, how do some among you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? ¹⁸ But if there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ is not risen. ¹⁴ And if Christ is not risen, then our preaching *is* empty and your faith *is* also empty. ¹⁵ Yes, and we are found false witnesses of God, because we have testified of God that He raised up Christ, whom He did not raise up-if in fact the dead do not rise. ¹⁶ For if *the* dead do not rise, then Christ is not risen. ¹⁷ And if Christ is not risen, your faith *is* futile; you are still in your sins! ¹⁸ Then also those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. ¹⁹ If in this life only we have hope in Christ, *we are of all men the most pitiable* (emphasis mine)." -1 Corinthians 15:12-19

Paul used logic to explain to them that, if they wanted to persist in this belief that resurrection wasn't possible, it meant that Jesus didn't even come back to life. If that were true, Paul explains, they were living a life that had no future and those departed members of their family (church and biological) were just gone, with no hope to see them again.

But Jesus did come back to life.

Because Jesus was raised, we can mirror that same activity (death, burial, resurrection) in baptism and expect to be raised up one day to live with Him forever (Rom 6:5-9; Jn 14:2-3). One day the Lord is going to come back from Heaven and our world's hourglass will have run out of sand. All of God's creation will stand before the Lord and give an answer for how they lived their lives (2 Cor 5:10). Christians can look forward to that day with anticipation and comfort, not fear, knowing that Jesus was raised. We are not living a useless or a pointless life. In fact, because resurrection is real and Jesus was raised up before everyone else, that means we are the least pitiable of all God's creation. Regardless of what troubles, trials, or tribulations may come, Christians are blessed with the answers and the power to overcome them. We are equipped to appropriately handle any situation in life, both fortunate and unfortunate, because Jesus' life didn't end in the tomb. The word around us though is pitiable. Their whole identity, if not enveloped by Jesus' blood and implanted into His body, is vanity. Pray for them, feel for them, reach out to them. Pity them. But we, are joyful in the Lord (*Jn 16:20-22*).
